

HST Against Spanish ERP Aid Proposal

WASHINGTON, April 1 (AP)—The White House said today that President Truman is "heartily opposed" to the "welcome Franco" provision the house wrote into the European recovery plan.

Presidential Secretary Charles G. Ross so quoted the chief executive to reporters. He said Mr. Truman hopes the provision will be knocked out before congress finally finishes work on the measure.

Ross volunteered the president's views at a news conference.

He said he had talked with Mr. Truman about the provision to include Spain in ERP. He added:

"The president is utterly opposed to that provision."

"He trusts it will be stricken out in the conference on the bill."

"Conference"

The efforts now being made to compromise different bills passed by the senate and house are known

in congressional language as a "conference."

State department authorities particularly are upset by the section written into the bill by the house. They said it already is having a bad effect in Europe and furthermore runs contrary to current policy on two major points:

1. The air program was designed to let the 16 cooperating European nations determine themselves whether any other nations should be invited to participate.

2. As for the Franco regime, present policy is to soft pedal denunciations of his government but, on the other hand, not to rush into closer and more friendly relations with it.

GOP's Worry Over Truman Ouster Move

CHICAGO, April 1 (AP)—Some Republicans began worrying openly today about the possibility that the democrats may talk President Truman into giving way to another presidential nominee.

An assertion by Rep. A. J. Miller (R-Neb.), that backing democrats are acting "like a pack of marauding jackals in attempting to tear down the candidacy of Harry S. Truman" was picked up quickly here by Warren Wright.

Wright, unofficial manager of a campaign aimed at landing the GOP presidential nomination for Gen. Douglas MacArthur, told a reporter he would rather see the general run against President Truman than any other available dem-

ocrat. He said he had talked with Miller about this.

Wright was voicing a view that has been passed around quietly in the camps of other GOP hopefuls such as Senator Robert A. Taft of Ohio and Gov. Thomas E. Dewey of New York. They frankly think Mr. Truman will be easier to beat than some democrat who could unify his party.

Some republicans talk of Secretary of State Marshall as about the only democrat who could step quickly into the nominee's shoes—should the president withdraw—this, de-

spite Marshall's vigorous rejection of previous political passes.

Dewey, changing trains here today on an invasion of Wisconsin, was ready to let go with a round-house swing at the president's foreign policies in a Milwaukee speech tonight.

Sift flour before measuring. Use level measurements for all ingredients.

Sift together 5 times—

3/4 cup sifted Sperry Drifted Snow "Home-Perfected" Enriched Flour

1/2 cup sifted granulated sugar

4 tablespoons cocoa

Measure into a large bowl—

1 1/2 cups egg whites (about 12)

Beat with a flat whip until egg whites are frothy. Add—

1 teaspoon cream of tartar

1/2 teaspoon salt

Continue beating until egg whites are glossy, fine-grained and will stand up in a stiff point (but not dry). Then gradually add, gently folding in after each addition—

1 cup sifted granulated sugar

Fold in—

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

Gradually and gently fold in the sifted dry ingredients. Pile batter into an ungreased tube pan, 10 inches in diameter, and bake in a preheated slow oven, 325°, for 1 hour 20-25 minutes, or until top of cake springs back when lightly pressed. Remove from oven and invert pan on cake rack until thoroughly cold. Remove cake from pan and spread sides and top of cake with Bittersweet Icing.

Bittersweet Icing

Measure into a small saucepan—

1/2 cup granulated sugar

1/2 cup cream

Bring just to the boiling point and pour hot mixture over—

3 squares unsweetened chocolate, chopped or grated (3 ounces)

Beat until chocolate is melted and mixture is smooth. Let cool slightly before spreading on cake.

*Note: For a sweeter icing use semi-sweet chocolate.
