

Marines Fired On Without Warning By Chinese Reds; Survivors Tell Of Event

TSINGTAO, China, April 2 (AP)—Four U. S. marines released by the Chinese communists after three months captivity said today they were fired upon without warning by the Reds.

Cpl. William L. Pollard of Fort Worth, Tex., said the fifth leatherneck in the Christmas duck hunting party fell mortally wounded in the first blast. He was Pfc. Charles J. Brayton Jr., Governor's Island, N. Y.

Released at the coastal city of Haiyang north of here yesterday, the four marines said in an interview they did not know the Chinese they saw Christmas Day were communists.

"We thought they were nationalist troops, so we waved our hats and hollered 'Meikuo' (American marines)," said Pollard.

"Then they opened fire point blank at us from about 200 yards," Pollard said the marines did not return the communists' fire.

"When the Reds stopped firing, we stood up from behind the jeep where we had run for shelter," he went on. "I saw Brayton lying on his back. He was bleeding from a wound in his arm."

Pollard said the communists refused to let the marines administer first aid to Brayton.

Brig. Gen. G. C. Thomas, commanding fleet marine forces in the Western Pacific, said Brayton's body would be returned to Marine headquarters here in a few days. He did not elaborate.

Pollard said the communists were "poor shots—otherwise we all would have been killed."

After refusing to permit them to give first aid to the wounded marine, Pollard said, the Reds made them put Brayton into the jeep.

"That was the last time we saw him alive," he added.

The other marines, liberated after three months of negotiations between the navy and the communists, are Pfc. Carroll W. Dickerson, Olathe, Kas., Pvt. Robert Hart, Pittsburgh, Pa., and Pfc. Thomas Kapodistria, Buffalo, N. Y.

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Fever Threat To Elk Herd In Hoh Valley

PORT ANGELES, April 2 (AP)—An outbreak of shipping fever (hemorrhagic septicemia), a contagious animal disease, among cattle herds in the rough lower Hoh river valley started a one-man round-up today to save about 75 elk in the area.

Protector Boyd McCracken of the state game department and Biologist Art Crews of Aberdeen said removal of the elk from the Hoh area is necessary because two herds of cattle and goats in the valley are infected.

Twelve of the infected domestic animals died during the last week, Veterinarian J. D. Stevens of Sequim reported.

Approximately 400 other domestic animals have been vaccinated to prevent spread of the disease. Where it started is not known, but Doctor Stevens said it could have been brought here by cattle from an infected area.

McCracken said the elk would be taken to upper Goodman creek.
