

# DAR Conference Date Draws Near

Plans for the 37th continental congress of the National society, Daughters of the American Revolution which will convene in Constitution Hall, Washington, D. C., April 19, are rapidly taking shape. Oregon will have a representation of delegates from the various chapters of the state.

President General Mrs. Roscoe O'Byrne of the NSDAR has returned from a tour to attend state DAR conferences in nine states. In addressing these meetings Mrs. O'Byrne stresses national defense and universal military training. She says: "These are days when all must be defense minded, realizing our society's interpretation of the term 'National Defense' as meaning preparedness for protection and security, and not for aggression. Everyone is seeking peace, but we must keep the balance manifested in the Great Seal of the U. S.—the 13 leaves of the Olive Branch in the right claw of our 'Eagle,' the symbol of peace, and the 13 arrows in the left, the symbol of preparedness. Peace and preparedness form the perfect balance."
