LAKEVIEW, April 7 — The Lake County chamber of commerce was off to a new year today under the leadership of Jim Ogle, well-known rancher, who was elected president just before the annual meeting Monday night.

Two Rescue Team Men Reach Plane

MCHORD FIELD, April 7 (AP)—Two Seattle mountaineers have reached the wreckage of a missing air force plane on Pihluch peak, the air search and rescue service said today, but six other men, aiding in the search, were missing.

Lt. T. B. White said the six men, all civilians, were attempting to approach the plane yesterday on the southeast slope of the peak. They had not reported back early today, he said.

The officer said small L-5 (biplane) planes would be put into the air today in an effort to locate the party.

The plane was found about 2 p.m. yesterday afternoon by Bob Craig and Ira Spring, both of Seattle.

Bodies of the plane's three occupants were found in the plane, they reported. Capt. James E. McLaughlin, pilot, and 2nd Lt. Francis A. Gever, the co-pilot, were crushed against the instrument panel. The body of 1st Sgt. Carl T. Fields of Puyallup was behind them.

Spring and Craig said it would be almost impossible to remove the bodies at the present time because of avalanche conditions and heavy snow.

They recommended that a party of 20 experienced mountaineers be recruited to help in the evacuation when conditions permit.

The plane, missing since last Friday en route from McChord field to Sand Point naval air station, crashed into a vertical cliff at about the 4000-foot elevation, they reported.

Tule's Share Of Surplus Hospital Gear To Be Stored

TULELAKE, April 7—Tulelake's share of nearly \$50,000 worth of hospital equipment from the former base hospital at the war relocation center at Newell will be stored for the present by the bureau of reclamation in a sealed ordnance building in the former army area at the center.

Equipment and medical supplies were distributed by mutual agreement of representatives of organizations, health departments and physicians of Siskiyou, Modoc and Klamath counties working with the bureau of reclamation which has held custody since it was turned over several months ago by the army surplus.

Apparatus and medical supplies have already been taken to Klamath Falls and to Alturas. The bureau will hold Tulelake's share for one year or less, until some plan for organization of a hospital district for this area materializes.

Plans which have been under discussion for several months, call for a county-wide district for Siskiyou with a 25 or 30-bed hospital to be located here and one of similar size at Mt. Shasta.

Cost of the local hospital, which would probably reach \$400,000, would be financed equally between the federal government, state government and the taxable district.

Petitions for establishment of a district have already been circulated and it is expected that the hospital proposition will be on the November ballot.

Division of equipment between Tulelake and Alturas was nearly equal except that Alturas received the larger of two X-rays, need in their hospital being especially urgent for that type machine.

The equipment included two complete dental units and dental X-ray; mobile hospital X-ray, operating room table valued at \$1500, large autoclave and distilled water apparatus, valued at \$2500, large surgical diathermy, basal metabolic machine, operating cystoscope, two mobile suction and pressure machines, expensive bone surgery equipment, various operating room equipment, including surgical lamps, tables, hospital beds, surgical and diagnostic instruments and quantities of medical supplies.

Dr. Buford Hargus, who assisted with distributions, stated Tuesday that this city's share will go far toward equipping a hospital here.

Three Held In Portland Drug Theft

PORTLAND, April 7 (AP)—An hour after a drug store narcotics holdup last night, two Seattle men and their one-armed car driver were in jail here.

Two of the men were seized as they prepared to board a plane for Seattle. Detective Capt. William D. Browne said they had the drugs. Their companion was halted on the Interstate bridge as he neared the Washington side of the Columbia river.

Police here had been alerted earlier in the day that three men who might be planning a holdup were en route from Seattle. Detective Chief Emil Vallet and a squad of six men arrived from Seattle with descriptions of the trio and their car. When the car was stopped, plainclothes police trailed it to taxis.

Later the trail was lost, but a quick block of all exits from the city went into effect as soon as police were called by Drugist George E. Norton that he had just been robbed at the downtown Medical Arts pharmacy.

A shotgun squad arrested two men at the airport. Browne identified them as Raymond Charles Wockner, 40, and Martin Edward Rackner, 34. They did not resist. Browne said both men, as well as their com-

panion, had Washington state prison records.

Richard Grindeman, 43, arrested on the Interstate bridge and identified by Browne as the driver who headed north after leaving the two men at the airport, waived extradition and was returned to Portland.

Norton was confronted as he closed his drug store at 9 p. m. At gun point he reopened it and was tied and gagged with adhesive tape. Two of the men gathered up narcotics while the third man remained in the car, he told police after freeing himself.

The men were jailed under \$10,000 bail each.
