

Oregon Bred Horses Have Stake Event

Meadows Schedule Includes 15 Runs In Feature Class

PORTLAND, April 8.—Topped by the \$3000 added Oregon Breeders' Futurity, a five-furlong sprint feature exclusively for two-year-olds bred in Oregon, a record stakes program of fifteen events to total \$28,300 plus added monies was announced today by General Manager William P. Kyne for the 1948 spring-summer thoroughbred race meeting opening May 15th at Portland Meadows.

In the interests of encouraging the improvement of thoroughbred breeding in Oregon, Kyne has increased the futurity's purse by \$1000 over last year, establishing the juvenile contest as the classic of the forthcoming night racing season.

FOR THREE GRAND

Two \$3000 features have been carded, both for three-year-olds and upward, the Memorial Day handicap on Monday, May 31, and the Oregon handicap on Saturday, June 19. Both booked for one mile, these are expected to draw some of the most prominent runners in the west.

Next in importance is the Rose Festival handicap, a \$2500 test for three-year-olds and up over a mile and one-sixteenth on Saturday, June 12.

Heading the list of \$2000 events is the Fred Cantrell Memorial handicap, a one-mile romp on Saturday, June 5, named in honor of the former Portland Meadows presiding steward who was accidentally killed last February.

CHARITY BENEFIT

Also a \$2000 stakes tilt at a mile and one-sixteenth is the Shriner's handicap. Feature of a benefit program, the event is expected to lure a record throng to the Meadows, with the Portland Shrine charity fund receiving the entire proceeds of the day's gate receipts. The Shrine expects to sell 25,000 tickets for the benefit program Wednesday, June 23.

The Salem handicap May 22 and the Speed handicap May 29th are the meeting's other \$2000 stakes races.

Guaranteed purses will total a minimum average of \$7000 per day, Kyne announced.
