Active Trade Boosts Grains

CHICAGO, April 8 (AP)—An active trade sent grains up for good advances on the board of trade today.

Wheat was aided by a pessimistic private crop forecast for Kansas, overnight sales of flour to foreign countries, a hike of 1 1/2 cents a bushel in the price the government will pay for cash wheat, and purchases of more than a million bushels of wheat by the government yesterday.

Wheat closed 1 1/2-3/4 higher, May \$2.49-\$2.49 1/2, corn was 3 1/2-5/8 higher, May \$2.26-\$2.26 1/2, oats were 1/2-1/4 higher, May \$1.14 1/2-1/4, and soybeans were 6 cents higher, May \$3.91.

Some Stocks Show Gains

NEW YORK, April 8 (AP)—Upward tendencies were exhibited by individual favorites in today's stock market although light selling depressed many leaders.

Profit cashing on the lengthy rise was in evidence from the start. Dealings were among the slowest of the past three weeks. Volume for the full proceedings, however, was in the neighborhood of 1,000,000 shares.

A few aircraft pushed forward on expectations of large-scale military orders. Rails did little in response to the move for increased passenger fares.

Montgomery Ward, U. S. Smelting, Nickel Plate Railroad and Erie Railroad went into new high territory for the year. Ahead most of the time were Boeing, Douglas Aircraft, U. S. Steel, General Motors, Schenley, International Paper, Mission Corp., Standard Oil (NJ) and Eastern Air Lines.
