Italian UN Move Vetoed

LAKE SUCCESS, April 10 (AP)—Russia vetoed Italy's bid for United Nations membership today for the third time.

The security council vote was 9 to 2 with Russia and the Soviet Ukraine voting against the admission of Italy.

The vote came a few minutes after Russia charged the United States with using the United Nations to influence the coming Italian elections.

Soviet Delegate Andrei A. Gromyko told the security council the U. S. was trying to force a Russian veto of Italy's bid for UN membership.

The American move for action on Italy's application at this time is a "tactical maneuver," Gromyko said.

Coal Strike End Seen Soon

WASHINGTON, April 10 (AP)—House Speaker Martin (R-Mass.) took 13 minutes today to get John L. Lewis and a principal mine operator to agree on a step that Martin said could end the coal strike by Tuesday.

In a surprise move as peacemaker, Martin got Lewis and Era Van Horn, coal operator, to agree on Senator Bridges (R-N.H.), as the third trustee for the miners' welfare and retirement fund.

Lewis and Martin agreed a settlement could be worked out within 48 hours after that.

Briggs promptly accepted and Lewis, as chairman, called their first meeting for 10 a. m. (EST) tomorrow.

Martin's unexpected move came just 24 hours before the Justice department plans to hale Lewis into federal court to show cause why he shouldn't be punished for contempt.

Cooling Off Time Ordered

ROME, April 10 (AP)—The cabinet Friday ordered a 32-hour political cooling off period before Italians vote April 18.

In its last session before the elections the cabinet ordered campaigning to end at midnight April 16. This gives a 32-hour respite before voting starts at 8 a. m. the following Sunday.

Premier Alcide De Gasperi, his bags packed for a last week of campaigning, presided over his anti-communist cabinet.

In another election decree the cabinet ordered schools closed from April 20 to 22 so students can be used as election aides.

Disappearance Of Sardine Probed
LOS ANGELES, April 10 (AP)—A tri-state study has been proposed to bring back the absentee sardine to Pacific coast waters.

California, Washington and Oregon experts — from state agencies and commercial fisheries — will begin investigation at once, California officials said yesterday.

Expert consensus to date has it the sardine has just been virtually fished out.
