

# Female Lab Trial Champ

## Gun Moll Flawless In Capturing Open All-Age; Peggy In Second

Tri-Blade Gun Moll, a four-year-old female Labrador retriever, took top honors in the Shasta-Cascade Retriever club's two-day licensed dog trials, coping first place in the open all-age stakes and thereby taking the Massey Challenge trophy.

Gun Moll is owned by Mike Crakes of Minneapolis, Minn., and was handled by Roy Gonia, prominent Pacific Coast trainer and handler. An almost flawless performance was turned in by the Lab, who worked her way to the top through some 39 top-flight retrievers.

Another female Lab, PTG Gilmore's Peggy, annexed the second slot, handled by Charles Morgan. Peggy is not quite three years old, is owned by Dr. L. M. Evans, of St. Cloud, Minn.

Other winners in the open event included Rip of Wake, a two-year-old Labrador owned and handled by Ben Stafford, of El Cajon, Calif., won third place, while Dual Champion Silvering Nitro Express, an eight-year-old Golden retriever, handled by Roy Wallace and owned by Ben L. Boalt, of Milwaukee, Wis., took fourth slot ribbon.

Certificates of Merit went to Yakima Valley Queen, a three-year-old Lab handled by Roy Gonia and owned by Mr. and Mrs. S. Beall Jr., of Puyallup, Wash., and Eliot's Prince Smoky, a two-year-old male Lab, owned and handled by J. V. Elliot Jr., of Pasadena, Calif.

The open stakes were run Sunday, with field work completed in the morning and water trials held in the afternoon. An estimated 150 to 200 spectators witnessed the event, braving cold wind and rain to watch the workouts.

The entire meet was conducted under punishing conditions, both to dogs and handlers. Wind, rain and snow marked Saturday's workouts, and much the same conditions were prevalent Sunday, though the wind was not quite so cold.

Junior and non-winners stakes were run Saturday. Brinnall's Gringo, a Lab male owned by Clifford N. Brinnall, of Long Beach, Calif., and handled by Roy Gonia, grabbed top honors in the junior event, for dogs under two years.

Other winners in the junior stakes included Rip of Wake, a Lab male owned and handled by Ben Stafford, of El Cajon, Calif., in second place; Lightning, a Lab female owned by M. B. Wallace, St. Louis, Mo., and handled by Charles Morgan, in third place, and Big Trouble of Audion, a Lab male owned and handled by Charles Morgan, of Random Lake, Wis., in fourth place.

Knight of Deer Creek, a Lab male owned by C. S. Cummins and handled by Roy Gonia, took first place in the non-winners event. He was followed by Bankhurst Brent, a Lab male owned by Charles R. Frazier, of Lanikai, Hawaii and handled by Ralph Crowe, in second place; Frank Hane's Lobo Marino, a Lab male owned and handled by Frank Hane, of Los Angeles, in third place; and fourth place, Hane's Black Sambo, a Lab male owned and handled by A. W. Lane, of Hollywood, Calif.

# Tacoma Nine Looks Strong In W League

## Jerry Nelson, Late Of Medford, Moves Into Class B Ball

TACOMA, April 12 (AP)—Not all the promised talent has checked into the club's spring camp at Walla Walla, but the Tacoma Tigers will be contenders in the forthcoming Western International league pennant chase if statements emanating from headquarters of the parent San Diego Padres can be accepted at face value.

Jim Brillheart, who steps down from the Padre roster for his first managerial venture, can rattle off the names of some 25 players who are battling for the 17 places on the squad to be carried during the regular campaign, and that collection of manpower represents survivors of a weeding out operation which has already sent a dozen hopefuls on their way.

Still to come are several players still drawing San Diego paychecks pending the final slash of the Padre roster down to the Pacific Coast league limit.

COMPETITION KEEN Pitchers Cy Greenlaw, Mitch Cletkovich and Stan Gilson. Outfielders Dick Greco, Glenn Stetter and Gene Clough and infielder Hank Velez are holdovers from the 1947 Tiger squad, and competition has become so keen already that not more than five of that group can be expected to land jobs this season.

Rav Forter, who was with Victoria, B. C., on option from the Padre last season; Bob Schulte and Angelo Venturini, California league graduates; Earl Chapple, a member of the San Diego club during much of the '47 campaign; and Ken Clay, Jim Gleason and Jerry Nelson, newcomers to professional baseball, are among the other moundsmen on hand.

The catching is being handled adequately by three W-L newcomers—Joe Rossi, Charley Luis and Bernard Hargadon. Rossi, who hit .383 in the big state league last season, seems assured of the No. 1 backstopper berth, with Hargadon and Luis fighting it out for the second spot.

Greco and Valle are the first base candidates at the moment, although both may be moved to the outfield if San Diego shows a likelier guardian of the inner sack northward. If and when he reports, Bob Gorbould figures to take over at second base, while Larry Lee seems a cinch at third. Joe Castin, Vito De Vito and Hank Sejarra are contenders for the shortstop job and the possibility still exists that Ray Tran may be shoved this way by the Padres.
