

Pay-As-You-Go Highway Financing Favored By Klamath County People

Members of the state legislative interim committee on highways left Klamath Falls after a hearing Monday with definite impressions that the people in this part of the state favor "pay-as-you-go" in highway and road financing.

The hearing was concluded at mid-afternoon. The final feature was a rather lively discussion of the question as to whether Klamath Falls and Klamath county people are willing to give sufficient local support, especially through property taxes, for road work.

Members of the interim committee appeared inclined to lecture Klamath people on this subject, but were quickly informed that huge sums of money have been spent here on local road and street work with property carrying a heavy burden through improvement assessments, county taxes and bond issues.

Prevailing sentiment at the meeting, however, was against state bond issues for highway improvements. If more money must be obtained by state, and for distribution to cities and counties, it should come from gas tax increases, auto registration increases, and boosts in driver license fees, witnesses told the committee.

Frank Brown, Langell valley, speaking as representative of both the grange and farm bureau, said that some groups had been willing to go for as much as a 3 cent increase in the gas tax. Two cents was most commonly mentioned at the hearing as the limit for gas tax increases.

Suburban streets came in for serious discussion at the afternoon session when Ray Garrison made a presentation for the Klamath Suburban League, South Sixth Street improvement association and Shashy View grange.

A three-organization brief pointed to a need for enabling laws to permit organization of improvement districts for rural roads and especially suburban streets. Under

Students Out On Strike In Ouster Row

KEYSER, W. Va., April 14 (AP)—Students at Potomac State college went on strike Tuesday to protest the expulsion of a co-ed and her date for staying out after hours.

Following up a strike vote by 250 of the 650 students last night, 30 pickets appeared this morning in the rain in front of the main classroom building.

College President E. E. Church greeted the pickets with an announcement there would be classes as usual. Between 15 and 20 students entered the building, but some later left.

The institution is a branch of West Virginia university at Morgantown. It functions as a two year junior college and as a four year teachers college.

Members of the student council said last night that the couple admitted remaining out after hours but "stated they are guilty of no other misconduct."

Trains Back On Schedule

WASHINGTON, April 14 (AP)—The government Tuesday dropped all restrictions put on train service during the coal strike.

The cancellation is effective at 1 p. m. (PST) today.

The interstate commerce commission and the office of defense transportation said the restrictive orders are being suspended "until further notice."

They indicated they will be applied again unless coal flows normally to build up the railroad stockpile, now down to about 20 days supply.

The major restrictions were a cut of 25 per cent in movement of railroad trains using coal-burning 1937-motives.
