

Salary Scale Set For Klamath County Teachers

A salary scale for Klamath county school teachers for the school year 1948-49 has been adopted, setting starting pay for a teacher with no experience and with less than three years of college training at \$2200 a year. The scale graduates to \$4100 a year for a teacher with a master's degree and 10 years of experience credit.

Teachers entering service in the county school system may receive up to six years of credit for recent and successful experience.

In addition to the base salaries, principals of schools employing four or more teachers shall receive \$325 for general administration, \$35 each for the first 10 teachers and \$25 each for all additional teachers. Principals whose administrative duties include both elementary and high schools will receive an additional \$215.

Except in cases of hardship, all salaries will be paid in 12 equal monthly installments. Teachers will be allowed 10 days of sick leave each school year, accumulative to 20 days.

Italian Press Attacks Russian Stand On Trieste

The non-communist Italian press said today Russia stood aside all thought of a peaceful communist victory in Italy's elections by refusing to discuss a western power proposal to return Trieste to the Italians.

The Moscow radio announced rejection of the proposed discussions last night. The Russians also apparently ruled out a Yugoslav suggestion that Italy and Yugoslavia discuss the future of the free territory.

The Soviet announcement came as a blow to pro-Italians in Trieste. Some said a scheduled demonstration of 50,000 persons tomorrow night to hail the western proposal may turn into an anti-Russian show. Others said the Soviet move was an advance acknowledgment of a communist defeat in the Italian elections Sunday and Monday.

Il Messaggero, rightist Rome newspaper which has been impartial in its news reporting on the election campaign, said "there is no doubt that Christian democracy will defeat the front (the communist-dominated popular front) by several lengths."

Other newspapers, commenting on the news from Moscow, said Russia's act was a blow to Italy's communists.

The issue of the United States versus Russia in the Italian campaign was sharpened by communist blasts at U. S. Ambassador James C. Dunn.

Palmiro Togliatti, the communist leader, filed a complaint with the foreign ministry about "continuous intervention of foreign ambassadors in the election campaign."

The tug-of-war between Russia and the west continued in Berlin. A British-Russian investigation of the collision of a British transport plane and a Soviet fighter April 5 was abandoned when the Russian members of the commission failed to appear. The crash killed 15 persons.

The Russians, meanwhile, forecast that a separate currency revision will be instituted soon for Western Germany. They blamed the western powers for failure to reach agreement on the currency issue.

The 21 nations of the western hemisphere resumed their conference in Bogota after an interruption of five days caused by a bloody uprising for which U. S. Secretary of State Marshall blamed communists. The Moscow radio called the charge absurd. Before the conference is a resolution condemning communism in the western hemisphere.

Costa Rica's six-week-old civil war apparently neared its end in a rebel victory. Guatemala reports said Jose Figueres, rebel leader, has set up a provisional government in Cartago, Costa Rica's second city. The U. S. state department in Washington was advised last night that San Jose, the capital, is threatened by rebel troops.

Reds Veto Plan To Let Trieste Go

LONDON, April 14 (AP)—Russia has turned down the Western Power proposal to give Trieste back to Italy, the Moscow radio announced last night.

A Soviet note terming the suggestion unacceptable was delivered to the governments of Britain, France and the United States yesterday, the broadcast said.

Foreign Minister Georges Bidault of France first broached the idea publicly in a speech at Turin, Italy, on March 21. It was hailed frankly at the time as a bid for anti-communist support in the Italian elections next Sunday.

Paris Meet

The proposal called for a Paris meeting of the powers principally concerned early in May to consider the future of Trieste.

Yesterday's Soviet note, the broadcast said, pointed out that Trieste was created a free city and territory by the Italian peace treaty, signed by 21 nations, including the Big Four. It said revision of the treaty by means of "correspondence or by convening private conferences" is unacceptable and violates "elementary principles of democracy."

The note was in response to formal U. S.-British-French suggestions on Trieste made to Russia in notes on

March 20 and reiterated last Friday with an urgent request for action.

The territory—450 square miles and 330,000 people—now is occupied by British and American troops in one zone and by Yugoslav forces in the other. It lies exactly on the line which divides communist-controlled Eastern Europe from the west.

The Italian government and other rightists welcomed the western proposal for return of Trieste and hailed it in campaign speeches. The communists in Italy damned it as an "American-style swindle."
