Klamath Falls will play host to members of the Pacific Coast Aberdeen Angus association, buyers and interested persons here for the Angus show and sale to be held at the fairgrounds Sunday and Monday.

Most of the cattle consigned to the sale will arrive Friday but they started coming in Thursday.

F. E. (Gene) Mallory, secretary of the association and sale manager, has outlined the program which will start Saturday, April 17, at 9 a. m. with a meeting of directors and the sale committee in the Winema Hotel.

The women's auxiliary breakfast will be held at the Winema Sunday at 10 a. m. At 1 p. m. the show will be open at the fairgrounds with Ed R. Biagini judging the entries. On Monday at 11 a. m. an elk barbecue will be given at the fairgrounds for consignors, buyers and friends, followed at 1 p. m. by the sale in the sales pavilion with Earl O. Walters as auctioneer.

American Soldier To Die For Murder

TOKYO, April 15 (AP)—An American negro soldier was sentenced today to hang for the hammer slaying of four Japanese last October.

Pvt. Stratman Armistead, 32, of Thomasville, Ala., was convicted by a U. S. eighth army court martial of killing an eight-year-old girl, a nine-year-old boy and two adults and injuring seriously two women and another boy.

The Japanese were slain at Zama, west of Tokyo, October 26. The army charged that robbery was the motive. The death sentence is subject to review.

Word of the passing of one of Malin's pioneers in New Hampton, New York, April 10, was received by his daughter, Mrs. Max (Annie) Harterode of Merrill.

Mrs. Harterode's father, Karl Vavricka, died on his 82nd birthday, April 10, 1948. He came to Klamath county with a group of Czechoslovakians in 1909 and settled the town of Malin, where he farmed for several years before going to New York to make his home. Mental Case Tells Police About Killing

CHICAGO, April 15 (AP)—A young man recently released from psychiatric treatment led police today to the body of a woman and said he "believes" he strangled her.

The body of the woman, about 35, was in an alley with a necktie drawn tightly around the neck. The name Minnie Gillis was tattooed above the left knee.

Capt. John Griffin and Coroner A. L. Brodie said the man gave his name as Charles Stephens, 22, a chef and baker, formerly of Gads-

den, Ala. Brodie said he intends to ask the state's attorney to investigate why the man was released from the psychiatric hospital Monday "in his pathetic condition."

Griffin said the man told him he did not remember strangling the woman.

The officer said he received a telephone call from the man saying "I believe I just strangled a woman. I'll be at Madison and Clinton."

The man told officers he was not acquainted with the woman and that his last recollection before standing over her body was a visit to a tavern last night where he drank several bottles of beer.

Court Actions Save Dog

PITTSBURGH, April 14 (AP)—Brownie, a medium-sized part German shepherd dog, doesn't know it, but his courtroom behavior saved his life.

A jury convicted Brownie's owner of keeping a ferocious dog, a charge preferred by a man who claimed Brownie bit him.

Normally such a verdict means a death sentence for the dog involved. But Judge J. Frank Graf wanted to see the dog.

When Brownie was brought into the courtroom, he shuffled towards attorneys to have his head patted. Then, he looked up at the judge. That was enough — Judge Graf sentenced Brownie's owner to a year's probation and allowed the dog to go home.
