Stocks Show Good Gains

NEW YORK, April 16 (AP)—Stocks today hit another average high since last October in one of the fastest markets of the past two years.

The market was buoyant from the start. Heavy profit cashing intervened after midday and extreme advances running to a point or more were reduced in most cases near the close.

Stable blocks of low-quoted issues accounted for much of the volume which topped the 2-million-share level for the fourth time since 1940.

In front most of the time, a rumble at peaks for 1948 or longer, were U. S. Steel Bethlehem Steel, Santa Fe, Southern Pacific, Standard Oil (N.J.), Lockheed, Curtiss-Wright, and Superior Oil of Calif.

Bonds maintained a steady course. Major commodities weakened following forenoon strength. Cotton, toward the finish, was off \$2.50 to \$3.75 a bale.

At Chicago wheat ended down 4 1/2 to 4 3/4 cents a bushel, corn 1/2 to 3/4, and oats 1/2 to 3/4.

CO's Not Entitled To Pay For Time SAN FRANCISCO, April 16 (AP)—Conscientious objectors are not entitled to pay for the time they spent in civilian work camps in lieu of military service.

This was the ruling yesterday of the ninth U. S. circuit court of appeals. The decision upheld a conviction and six months jail sentence imposed by a federal district court in Portland against six conscientious objectors. All were convicted of deserting camps to which they were assigned in 1945.

Planting In Progress Here Wind-dried farm fields of the Klamath area were the scene of increasing activity today, with grain-seeding especially in evidence.
