 Klamath county 4-H club members will exhibit their project work next week at the annual County Spring fair at the fairgrounds, Mrs. W. M. Williams, general chairman, said recently.

April 22, 23, and 24 are the dates of the event and the club members will compete in many contests during the three days.

Some 800 club members will exhibit work in sewing, knitting, home-making, cooking, forestry, leathercraft and woodwork. A special poster contest will be judged during the fair. Any 4-H club work is eligible to enter this contest.

Special demonstrations will be given throughout the three days and special baking and sewing contests will be carried on. Club members are encouraged to participate in all events that are open for them. Mrs. Williams added.

The fair building will be open to the public during the day-time hours as well as Friday and Saturday evening at 7:30 and winners of special awards will be announced at that time.

In addition to scholarships given as prizes by the county fair board, local merchants have donated many special awards to be given to deserving 4-H club members. The scholarships include trips to 4-H club summer school in Corvallis, 4-H club summer camp at Lake of the Woods, and the state fair. County winners will represent Klamath county in the state contests.

Farm Loan Booklet Out

An attractive 12-page pamphlet explaining the Oregon veterans farm and home loan program has been released by the state department of veterans affairs and is ready for distribution, Director William F. Gaarenstroom announced this week.

The pamphlet is available, free, to veterans, county and veteran organization service officers, real estate agencies and others interested in the state's \$6500 loan for eligible Oregon veterans of World War II. Booklets are available at the department of veterans affairs, State Library building, Salem, or 416 SW 11th avenue, Portland.

Along with a clear explanation of the procedure for applying for the loan, the pamphlet contains 41 pertinent questions most frequently asked regarding the state loan act, and the answers.

Reproduced on the back cover of the booklet is a "Veterans' Time

Table," which gives in illustrated form the most important expiration dates of veterans' GI benefits.

Fifteen thousand copies of the pamphlet were printed in the plant of the state printing department.
