## Youths Face Burglary Count

Two separate charges, each for burglary not in a dwelling, have been placed against Ralph Weiser, 19, and Simeon Buchanan Riddle, 17, Indian youth, who were involved in a shooting at Bonanza Wednesday morning.

One complaint charges the boys with forcibly entering Pete and Babe's tavern at Bonanza, where both were targets of gunfire, and the other accuses them of burglarizing Curly's pool hall at Beatty earlier the same morning. At the pool hall a juke box was opened and the money taken.

Riddle is held in the county jail, while Weiser remains in Klamath Valley hospital. The latter was shot in the hip by Riley Comer, nightwatchman of the Bonanza tavern. Another shot struck a flashlight Riddle was said to have been carrying and inflicted only a bruise on his abdomen.

Weiser surrendered at Bonanza two hours after the shooting, but apparently sent officers on a wild goose chase by identifying his companion as a "Mexican or Indian called Baldy."

Riddle was located at Beatty late Wednesday and both he and Weiser have made statements admitting the break-ins.

**Terrill Enters Not Guilty Plea**  
A plea of not guilty was entered Friday morning in justice court for Glenn Terrill, 40, county tax assessor, who is charged with driving while intoxicated.

Terrill did not appear in court on the misdemeanor count and the plea was entered for him by Attorney J. C. O'Neill. Bail was set at \$200 or \$400 property, which the attorney said he would post.

Terrill was arrested Wednesday morning by state police while operating an automobile registered to Klamath county. He was jailed briefly and then released without bail.

## Holy Land Truce Asked

**NEW YORK, April 16 (AP)**—The second special Palestine session of the United Nations assembly was opened today with a renewed appeal for a Jewish-Arab truce in the Holy Land.

An immediate cease-fire was demanded by Joao Carlos Muniz of Brazil, who presided over the 57-nation assembly in the absence of its Brazilian retiring president, Dr. Oswaldo Aranha.

In a somber speech recognizing a possibility of UN failure to solve the Palestine problem, Muniz said: "Only the total suspension of hostilities can create the favorable atmosphere which will enable the assembly to find a solution capable of conciliating the existing antagonism through a broad formula of cooperation."

The session opened in what Muniz called "a disheartening atmosphere" caused in part by the fading chances for a Jewish-Arab acceptance of the truce formula now awaiting action in the security council.

As the assembly opened, the flags of the 57 nations were flying outside at half-staff in mourning for President Manuel A. Roxas of the Philippines who died yesterday.

**Woman Appointed On Harvard Staff**  
CAMBRIDGE, Mass., April 16 (AP)—Miss Helen Maub Cam, an authority on English constitutional history, has been appointed to the first full professorship granted a woman at Harvard university.

The appointment of Miss Cam as the first holder of the new Samuel Zemurray Jr. and Doris Zemurray Stone-Radcliffe professorship was announced jointly last night by Harvard and Radcliffe college.

The professorship, open only to women scholars, was endowed by a \$250,000 bequest by Samuel Zemurray of New Orleans, president of the United Fruit company.
