GRAINS SHOW SOME LOSSES

CHICAGO, April 17 (AP)—Weakness in corn spread to other sections of the grain market today. Wheat, after opening with fair-sized gains on the board of trade, reversed itself and dropped below the preceding close.

Cats eased and soybeans were offered 8 cents lower. At the start wheat showed a firm underflow. With no rain reported overnight, the weather bureau predicted fair and warm weather over the week-end for Texas, Oklahoma, Kansas and Nebraska. Temperatures were expected to get as high as 95 degrees today in parts of Oklahoma.

Trading was moderately active. Near the end of the first hour wheat was 1/4 to a cent lower, May \$2.47, corn was 1/4 to 2 cents lower, May \$2.23 1/2, oats were 1/4-1/2 lower, May \$1.14 1/2, and soybeans were down 8 cents, May offered at \$3.95.
