The Gallup Poll Prevention Of War Is Top Issue

PRINCETON, N. J., April 19—With the presidential campaign entering the crucial pre-convention stage, American voters have executed a dramatic about-face in naming the nation's most vital issue.

Today, the voting public in a mood reminiscent of 1939, gives priority to the prevention of another war, and high prices runs a poor fourth in the list of important national problems.

Interviewers for the American Institute of Public Opinion have very recently completed the latest in a long series of nationwide tests to determine the problem, voters think is the most important facing the country.

While the republican party has a slight edge in the above voting, the democrats are favored by several numerically important groups of voters, including independent voters, veterans of World War II and manual workers, particularly members of labor unions.

EXAMS SALEM, April 19 (AP)—A total of 117 former law students will take the state bar examinations here July 13 and 14, the state supreme court said today.

This shifting of opinion is similar to what occurred in the years immediately prior to the outbreak of World War II.

Further, history is repeating itself in another way, since both in 1939 and today the fall of Czechoslovakian democracy helped stimulate the public's apprehension of another war.

A thumbnail history of the past dozen years is provided in the following summary of peoples' major concerns:

101% (Total adds to more than 100 per cent because some voters gave more than one answer.)

In August of last year one out of four voters named high prices as the one issue that gave them most concern. All that time the number of voters whose uppermost concern was world affairs totaled 47 per cent, while today 60 per cent mention some phase of international affairs.
