# Retirement Change Eyed

PORTLAND, April 20 (AP)—The 1949 legislature may be asked to revise the retirement act to allow state agencies more discretion in retaining over-aged employees.

The highway commission indicated yesterday that a shortage of engineers could jeopardize the state's highway programs in the next several years.

"Many good engineers are still fit and able at 65," Chairman T. H. Banfield said. He added that the law should be revised to allow agencies more "leeway" in retaining experienced and capable executives.

In other discussions, the commission decided it would not ask for a road across the top of McNary dam or the proposed Columbia river dam at the mouth of the John Day river. It also declared it had no objection to tentative government plans for the John Day project.

Engineers were asked to prepare a new cost estimate for a sidewalk on a new bridge spanning the Umatilla river at Umatilla. The commission rejected an estimate of \$9000 as excessive.

Construction of guard rails along the Pacific highway south of Corvallis for protection of school children was approved.

# Crater Lake Faces Problem Over Stamps

MEDFORD, Ore., April 20 (AP)—Brother, can you share a stamp? That's the cry of the Crater Lake national park service these days.

Caught between the economies of the administration and a skyrocketing amount of business, the park is in the embarrassing position of being almost out of stamp money with a fair portion of the year yet to run.

The congressional appropriations committee cut the park service allowance for penalty (franked) postage about 40 per cent, explained Superintendent E. P. Leavitt. After a summer of record travel and an equal record amount of mail to answer, the park staff was startled to find that 60 per cent of the stamp money had been spent in three months.

Investigation brought out that it wasn't permissible to borrow money from some other fund and that there wasn't anything to do but make the remaining stamp allowance go around.

Accordingly, mail to the regional office was cut to three times a week, each envelope filled to the weight limit. Press releases and other services were stopped, requests for information filed away for answering when more stamp money came.

In the meantime, the Crater Lake National History association, a non-profit organization, came to the rescue with a little loan for stamps, and the staff is doling out its stamp money the best possible way.
