## Future Of Oregon Held To Be Good

SACRAMENTO, Calif., April 23 (AP)—T. Morris Dunne, chairman of the Oregon state unemployment compensation commission, said today his state has had "fine employment" throughout the winter and Oregon has a "hopeful, optimistic future."

Dunne spoke at the conference of the Pacific area bureau of inter-governmental relations. Gov. Earl Warren presided.

Oregon, which has grown by 40 per cent in population since 1940, has begun to receive migrants from California, Dunne said. These are largely attracted by work on various dam projects and the booming lumber industry.

Two years ago, 50,000 were employed in the lumber industry. There are now 81,000.

Oregon, Dunne said, bases a large part of her economy on industries which ship out of the state, principally lumbering and agriculture. The Marshall plan of sending aid to Europe, he declared, will "insure continued prosperity in Oregon," for that reason.

The state's returning veterans, he reported, have caused little upset in the state's economy.

Of the 140,000 Oregonians who joined the services, he said, 18,000 are now attending schools under the G. I. bill of rights, 67,000 received initial checks under the readjustment allowance, but only 1300 have exhausted their benefits under this allowance.

"This shows they are being absorbed into our economy," he said.

## AA Troops To Go To Alaska

FORT LEWIS, April 23 (AP)—Approximately 8000 anti-aircraft troops from various Far-West stations have been added to the 2300 from this post being sent to Alaska for a "summer training" session at the northern outpost, it was announced here Thursday.

The announced purpose of the sudden shift of manpower, which reduced Fort Lewis to a "deserted village" status, is to bring about a parity of forces in Alaska, previously manned only by air and service force personnel.

Troops from this post left the Seattle port of embarkation by water this week, following an advance party which flew north to make preparations for arrival of the troops at their new posts. It has not been announced where the Fort Lewis anti-aircraft contingents will be stationed.

## KU Students In Music Contest

Klamath Falls students were competing this week-end at Ashland in the Southern Oregon district music contest. Attending were Klamath Union high school and Sacred Heart academy students.

The KUHS orchestra competed Friday morning, the band Friday night; Saturday morning the girls' glee club and a cappella choir in the afternoon.

Most of the students left Friday for the valley city to enter the contest which was held in the Southern Oregon college auditorium. Andrew Loney Jr., director of music education in the city schools, accompanied the group as did other music department members.

## The Doctor Says—Undulant Fever Big Problem

All recent reports agree that the disease undulant fever, or brucellosis as it is sometimes called, is extremely common in the U. S. This disease is caused by a germ of which there are several varieties.

The germ of undulant fever is present in several different kinds of animals, especially cattle, hogs, sheep and goats. Human infections are usually acquired from drinking the milk or coming in contact with the meat of these animals.

Illness due to these germs is usually shown by fever, a chilly feeling, excessive sweating, loss of weight, headache and muscular pains. Sometimes a rash, nose-bleeds and other symptoms are present. The fever frequently goes up and down in a wave-like manner or undulations, which has given the disease its name.

### TREATMENT DIFFICULT

Undulant fever is likely to be chronic and long-continued and is rather difficult to treat in many instances, although a great number of methods have been tried. Recently a small group of patients have been treated with a combination of streptomycin and sulfadiazine and although it is too early

to be sure, the results seem promising.

Pasteurization of all milk would greatly cut down on the number of new cases of undulant fever. Some infections are acquired from direct contact with animals, especially in packinghouse workers.

Besides pasteurization and care in avoiding infection from contact with infected meat, the other most important problem is to eliminate the disease in the dairy industry, which is working hard to reduce infection.

It is estimated that between one in 10 and one in 100 of the inhabitants of this country are infected. The disease is hard to conquer once a person becomes infected and is one of our most important health problems existing today.

## Air Expansion Gains Support

WASHINGTON, April 23 (AP)—Senator Gurney (R-S.D.) said Thursday there is general support in the senate armed services committee for the administration's new 66-group air force program.

"No objection has been voiced to men" Gurney told reporters after a closed-door session of the committee.

The committee, of which Gurney is chairman, took no formal action. The latest defense program calls for an outlay of \$46,000,000,000 in the next three years.

Gurney said there is agreement within the committee on these two points in the overall bill which includes a temporary draft and universal military training:

1. The committee tentatively accepted a provision for registration of men 18 through 25 years under a temporary draft with actual inductions between 19 and 25.
2. The committee voted to require registration of all aliens in

this country from 18 through 25 years. Gurney said those who requested deferment in writing on the basis of not seeking citizenship would be exempted but also barred from ever seeking citizenship.

## Reuther To Get Degree

SAN FRANCISCO, April 23 (AP)—Walter P. Reuther, president of the United Automobile Workers of America, will be given the honorary degree of Doctor of Laws by St. Mary's college next month.

Reuther was shot and seriously wounded by an assassin at his Detroit home Tuesday, and it was not known if his injuries will permit him to appear for the college exercises May 30.

In making the announcement today, Brother Austin, president of St. Mary's, said Reuther was being honored for his record in American labor and because "he has stood up boldly against communist influence in our labor ranks."

Reuther, Brother Austin said, "has approached labor and the

working man from the point of view of man's dignity as a child of God. x x x"
