

Back-To-Work Movement Among Soft Coal Miners Speeds Up After Appeal

PITTSBURGH, April 22 (AP)—An increasing back-to-work movement among idle soft coal miners today gave promise that most of the 400,000 members of the United Mine Workers would be back on the job by week's end.

UMW district presidents, using telephone, telegraph, radio and newspaper stories, urged the word to all miners that their chiefs, John L. Lewis, has asked them to return.

Throughout the nation, union locals met and voted to go back to work. Still others scheduled meetings for today.

Miners, although still resentful about the \$1,420,000 fines imposed on Lewis and the union by the fed-

eral court Tuesday, apparently had decided to end their long walkout.

Thousands Today About 125,000 were at work yesterday and union officials promised many thousands more would enter the pits today.

Strike-hardened district 4 in Western Pennsylvania reported all its mines working and about 21,000 of its 22,000 miners on the job. This area, comprising Greene and Fayette counties, is heavily dotted with captive (steel company-owned) mines.

Other Pennsylvania areas expected anywhere from 75 to 90 per cent of their miners to be on the job today.

Union officials said they expected full production in Ohio today. The

state has 18,000 miners, of whom only 300 worked yesterday. Reported idle in other states yesterday were: Pennsylvania about 60,000, Kentucky 40,000, Alabama 18,000, Virginia 14,000, Tennessee 10,000, Indiana 6,000, Illinois 3,500, Colorado 2,000, Maryland less than 2,000, Oklahoma-Arkansas 1,000, Wyoming 700, Montana 700.

Steelworkers To Hold Wage Talks

SPOKANE, April 22 (AP)—Permanent Metals corporation and United Steelworkers of America (CIO) will reopen wage sections of contracts affecting some 3000 employees at Trentwood and Mead Aluminum plants May 1, a union spokesman said Wednesday.

Otto Orr, national representative of the steelworkers' union said Carl Gutschall, chief grievance man for Trentwood local 338, left last night for Pittsburgh to attend a meeting

at which a wage pattern will be established.

Orr said Steelworkers' President Philip Murray recently opened negotiations with United States of America for a "substantial" wage increase and institution of social insurance.
