

Millionaire Bob Topping, Lana Turner Wed In Huge, Well-Staged H'Wood Rites

HOLLYWOOD, April 27 (AP)—Well, it was quite a production, Lana Turner, the bride, was radiant, and nervous. Her white-orchid corsage trembled. She went upstairs and lay down to rest for a half hour after the ceremony.

She spoke her "I wills" at just above a whisper. "The movies" bludgeoned her, she was far less poised than in the 11 times she has been married in well-rehearsed movie scenes.

Her dark-haired, millionaire bridegroom, Henry J. (Bob) Topping, 34, heir to a linoleum fortune, said his vows with calm assurance. The black-robed clergyman told them solemnly in the ceremony: "Henry and Lana, let us believe that in the province of God you have at last found each other." He adjured them to "plan together,

play together, and—most important of all—pray together."

 Lana wore a sheer champagne lace gown over a champagne satin slip that did full justice to her celebrated figure. Her blue eyes sparkled, her cheeks were a tanned pink. The ceremonial room was fragrant and aglow with green fern and white blossoms.

 Lana was married in the white, plaster-walled living room of William R. (Billy) Wilkerson, movie trade-paper publisher, who discovered her for movies 11 years ago when she was sipping a milkshake. He served as best man.

Minnesotan Bids For Oregon Vote

PORTLAND, April 27 (AP)—Harold E. Stassen said here last night the nation should outlaw the communist party and take steps to create a strong world police force to halt war.

His address was filled with references to what he called the menace "of the communist totalitarianism of Russia."

In calling for a "collective security association" of freedom-loving nations, he said it would serve to halt further aggression until the United Nations can be strengthened. He added that the UN must get rid of the veto. He said the "real danger of the world is that the leaders of the Kremlin may make a mad move toward war."

He referred to the Colombia riots and the experience of Czechoslovakia in urging outlawing of the communist party.

"An American policy must be formulated to counter these dangers," he said. "Outlaw the communist party overground, and vigorously dig them out from underground."

His audience cheered this statement. But during a forum session after his speech a woman waved a copy of the nation's Bill of Rights. She asked Stassen how he justified his belief as a citizen who championed American democracy. He cited an Ohio supreme court ruling in which the court held that the constitution guarantees a republican form of government.

Stassen was here to formally open his bid for Oregon's republican presidential preference vote due May 21. He is opposed by Gov. Thomas E. Dewey of New York in the balloting. Dewey starts on a 10-day tour of the state May 1; Stassen will return to Oregon later.
