Rock Tossed At Red Meet

PORTLAND, April 29 (AP)—A rock thrown through a window interrupted momentarily a speech by Claudia Jones, secretary of the women's commission of the communist party, last night.

No one was injured and the incident was not repeated. Miss Jones, a native of Trinidad who is facing a deportation hearing on the charge she advocates overthrow of the government, said the stone-throwing was provoked by Harold E. Stassen's statement here Monday night that the communist party should be outlawed.

She said the Truman administration is threatening the liberties of all citizens, accused the United States of trying to start war against the Russians "who fought so bravely against fascist Germany," denied that American communists take orders from Russia, and commended Henry Wallace for "speaking the fight in America against imperialism and for civil liberties."

About 125 persons attended the meeting in Norse hall.

Shots Fired At School Teacher

NEW YORK, April 29 (AP)—A pretty blonde Brooklyn high school teacher conducted mathematics examinations under police guard today after her home was the target of a fusillade of rifle shots last night.

Only a few minutes before the rifle fire the mother of Miss Margaret Jokiel, the high school teacher, received two mysterious phone calls from an anonymous feminine caller who said:

"If she doesn't pass everyone in mathematics tomorrow something will happen. She'll be pushing up daisies."

Blue-eyed, 24-year-old Miss Jokiel said today "I'm not afraid" as she supervised examinations in the Fort

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Hamilton high school. Beside her at all times in classrooms and halls was Police Sgt. George J. Noell, an uncle assigned to guard her.

Police hurried a thorough investigation of Miss Jokiel's 165 pupils and the source of the phone calls to the teacher's mother, Mrs. Esther Jokiel, also a teacher.

As Mrs. Jokiel hung up last night a volley of gunfire broke the silence of the Brooklyn side street where they live. Police said about 30 shots, some of which struck the house, were fired, probably by 25 caliber and 32 caliber automatic rifles.

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
