GRAINS SHOW SLIGHT GAINS

CHICAGO, April 28 (AP)—Grains firmed under short-covering on the board of trade here today. The May contracts showed best gains with new crop corn; deliveries inclined to lag. Trading was moderately active.

To some extent the buying in May futures was based on fears of a railroad strike, dealers said.

Other factors in the upturn were trade reports the government had entered the flour market on the Pacific coast, a firm demand for cash grain, and a boost of 1 1/2 cents in the level at which the commodity credit corporation will buy cash wheat, Kansas City.

Wheat closed 2 to 4 1/2 higher. May \$2.44-2.45, corn was 1 1/2-3 1/2 higher, May \$2.21-2.22, oats were 1/2-2 1/2 higher, May \$1.10-1.11, and soybeans were 8 cents higher, May \$4.08.

NEW YORK, April 28 (AP)—Stocks edged cautiously higher today with the oil providing market leadership.

Buying orders centered on individual favorites and many pivotal industrials were virtually ignored. Considerable irregularity resulted, holding the average advance within narrow limits.

Scattered gains of fractions to nearly 2 points were racked up for many industrials. Total sales running to around 1,400,000 shares were somewhat under Tuesday's pace.
