

Morse Asks More Funds For Forest Laboratory And For Forest Highways

WASHINGTON, April 29 (AP)—Senator Morse (R-Ore.) asked the senate appropriations committee Wednesday to increase funds in the agriculture department bill for the forest products laboratory, forest highways and for timber sales.

Morse asked that the house approved figure of \$1,000,000 for the laboratory at Madison, Wis., be increased to \$1,550,000. He said the laboratory had been of great help to industry in the Pacific Northwest with its research into use and manufacture of plywood.

The forest utilization service will have to be reduced, he said, unless the house cut of \$250,000 from budget estimates is restored. He also asked an additional \$300,000, the amount eliminated last year, for the work.

Suspect Held In Robbery

RENO, Nev., April 29 (AP)—Sporting an expensive new automobile, the second of two men sought for the Flamingo hotel at Las Vegas was arrested here Wednesday.

Captain of Detectives Joseph Kirkley identified him as Carl H. Zooleck, 23, a clerk at the fabulous Las Vegas hotel and gambling casino once owned by the assassinated Bugsy Siegel.

A second suspect, also a clerk at the hotel, Milner Jarvis, was arrested in Seattle yesterday.

Jarvis was charged with grand larceny and Zooleck with embezzlement. The \$47,000 was stolen from a hotel strongbox belonging to Gus Greenbaum of Phoenix, Ariz., part owner of the Flamingo. The money disappeared last Wednesday night.

Captain Kirkley said Zooleck admitted the theft, and signed a statement implicating himself and Jarvis.

Fortune In Lead Found In Ship

PORTLAND, April 29 (AP)—Henry Kaiser's Consolidated Builders, Inc., ship scrapers here since the war, Wednesday reported finding an estimated \$100,000 to \$150,000 worth of pig lead at the bottom of a navy transport.

Albert Bauer, general manager, said it was not known the lead was in the ship when it was bought for \$65,750. He explained, however, that the company had taken a chance on the finding lead ballast after studying the draft and trim of the ship while it was moored at Astoria.

The firm had bid substantially higher than other scrapping firms. The others ranged from \$28,000 to \$35,000.

The vessel was built in 1920 for passenger service and was converted to the Transport Leonard Wood in 1940.

Fire Prevention Program Slated

The Keep Oregon Green committee has launched its annual fire prevention program this week with fire prevention talks and films in city and county schools.

Already seven city schools have been given the programs which are being continued in county schools, six of which will be visited by Friday.

The two films being shown are "Frying Pan and Fire," a picture telling of two co-eds on a camping trip, and "Lifehood of the Land," a watershed management picture.

"Technicians of the Portland, Ore., forest experiment station, he said, are rendering invaluable service in that area.

"The senator, in a second request given the committee in his absence, asked more money for forest highways. The house cut budget figures from \$5,300,000 to \$5,000,000.

"The federal aid highway program of 1944, Morse said, contemplated expenditure of \$75,000,000 over a three-year period for forest roads. To date, he said, only \$9,800,000 has been voted.

"The amount apportioned to Oregon from the annual authorization of \$25,000,000 is about \$3,421,000," he said. "Oregon's share of the \$5,000,000 (house) appropriation would be about \$684,000.

"With an annual appropriation of \$25,000,000 it is estimated that it would take about 23 years to complete planned work on forest highways."

He said forest highways serve national forest property somewhat as farm-to-market roads serve agricultural areas, handling traffic for fire protection, for hunting, fishing and recreation purposes.

The senator said the house had cut funds for timber sale by the forest service from a budget estimate of \$600,000 to \$400,000. He said this will mean a timber sale loss of \$1,000,000 and it is poor economy to save \$200,000 and lose \$1,000,000.

Dewey To Visit Eugene May First

EUGENE, April 29 (AP)—Thomas E. Dewey, republican presidential candidate, will visit this city May 5 and will give a talk here after visiting local sawmills and the University of Oregon campus. Dewey and a party of 20 will arrive from Portland via chartered bus and will attend a dinner meeting at the Osburn hotel, to be featured in a state-wide radio broadcast.

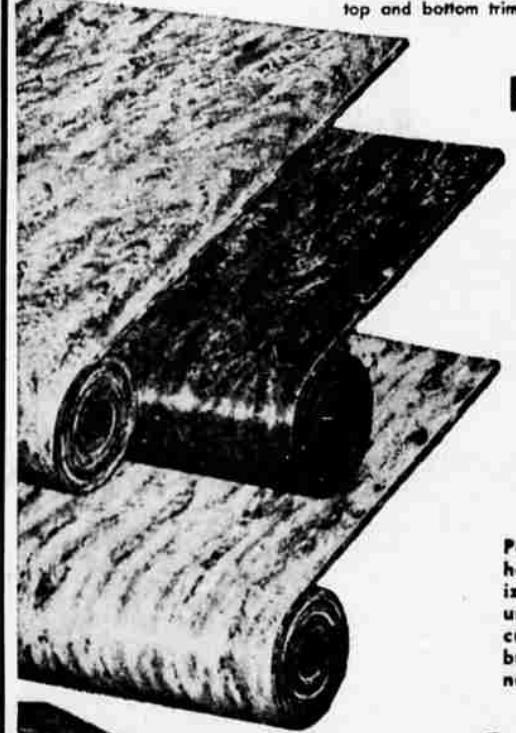

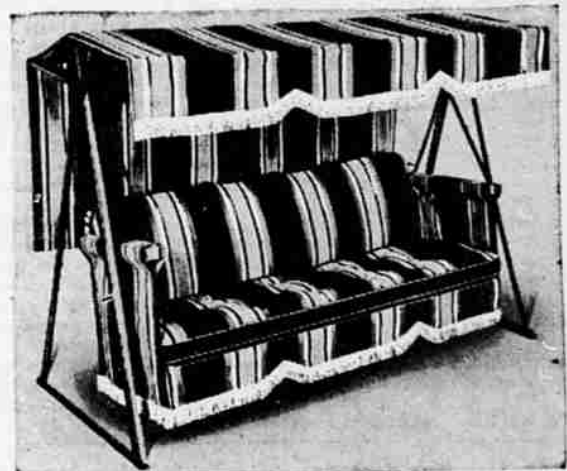
