Texas Man Speaks Here

The way to utilize divine power to heal mankind of its ills and to restore harmony to a disordered world was presented in a public lecture Tuesday night in the First Christian church by James Harry McReynolds, of Dallas, Tex., a member of the board of lecturership of the mother church, the First Church of Christ, Scientist, in Boston, Mass.

The lecture was given under the auspices of the First Church of Christ, Scientist, of Klamath Falls and the subject was "The Availability of Divine Power as Revealed by Christian Science."

McReynolds quoted from the Bible the statement from the prophet Habakkuk that God is "of purer eyes than to behold evil," and cannot "look on iniquity," and from the Christian Science textbook, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures," by Mary Baker Eddy, the discoverer and founder of Christian Science (p. 356), "God is as incapable of producing sin, sickness, and death as He is of experiencing them and desiring them." He continued by saying that if God cannot behold and experience them, it should be evident that He could not make man capable of beholding or experiencing them.

From 12:30 p. m. to 4 p. m. on Sunday the May dinner will be served by members of the Fellowship group. Reservations can be made by calling 5571.


