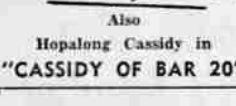

Few Changes
In Budget

Very few changes were made in the proposed 1948-49 Klamath county budget Friday during the official "gripe" session conducted by the county court and budget committee.

County Judge U. E. Reeder said that some of the courthouse departments requested minor changes and pay increases were provided for key workers in several cases.

Expected complaints from the juvenile department over the \$1200 reduction in the salary budget for Ron Hewitt, juvenile officer, failed to develop.

Next Wednesday at the courthouse the budget committee will hold its formal public hearing on the proposed budget document and at that time anyone may come in and go over the budget.

Indians Attack
US Workers

GUAYAQUIL, Ecuador, May 3 (AP)—Government troops are reported en route to the town of Chunchi, where an American construction company said it was under attack by several hundred Indians.

A dispatch from Quito said Saturday an official of the Jones Construction company of Charlotte, N. C., had sent an appeal for help to "prevent the burning of the house where they are defending themselves after the incidents." Reports said a worker had been killed.

An undetermined number of American employees, their wives and children are in the camp.

The government ordered troop mobilization and dispatched Mayor Cesar Montufar, general commander of the civil squad, to Chunchi, which is on the Quail-Quito railroad line.

The Jones company has been constructing a road from Chunchi to Cuenca. Workers in the camp were reported to be demanding the indemnity stipulated in the labor code in the case of unreasonable dismissal.

Reno Proves Too
Much For System

LAS VEGAS, Nev., May 3 (AP)—Luck finally deserting them, two University of Chicago graduates repaired to the ante room Saturday to overhaul their system.

Their formula for roulette riches sprang a leak yesterday when a 14-hour assault on a local gambling club produced a net loss of \$610.

Albert Hibbs, 23, Chillicothe, O., and Dr. Roy Walford, 23, San Diego, lost all the money won last week using their undisclosed system at another club.

But they still held hopes of hitting the combination which brought them \$8000 at Reno last November.

LA Thermometer

LOS ANGELES, May 3 (AP)—The official Los Angeles temperature as of Saturday is really on the level; ground level, that is.

For years other sections of the nation have kidded the city because the weather bureau's official thermometer was on the federal building roof. The folks said the chamber of commerce must have fixed that so it'd appear to be a little cooler on extremely hot days and a little warmer when it's chilly.

Now, said H. W. Douglas, meteorologist in charge, a new ground recording station has been established on the federal building parking lot.

Channel Bids
Due May 17

Invitations will be issued about May 17 for bids on improvement and enlargement of the Lost river diversion channel six miles south of Klamath Falls, according to the reclamation bureau.

The work will include construction of earthwork and structures on the canal from Lost river to Klamath river. The work includes excavation of about 1,050,000 cubic yards; furnishing and erecting 17,420 pounds of structural steel; installing gates and miscellaneous metalwork.

Some 430 days will be allowed for completion.

Mr. and Mrs. Charles Hitchcock are at home again after spending several months at Willow Ranch, Calif.

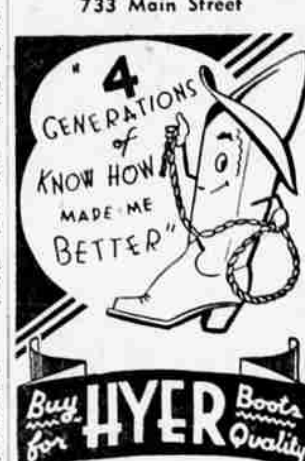
FOREST

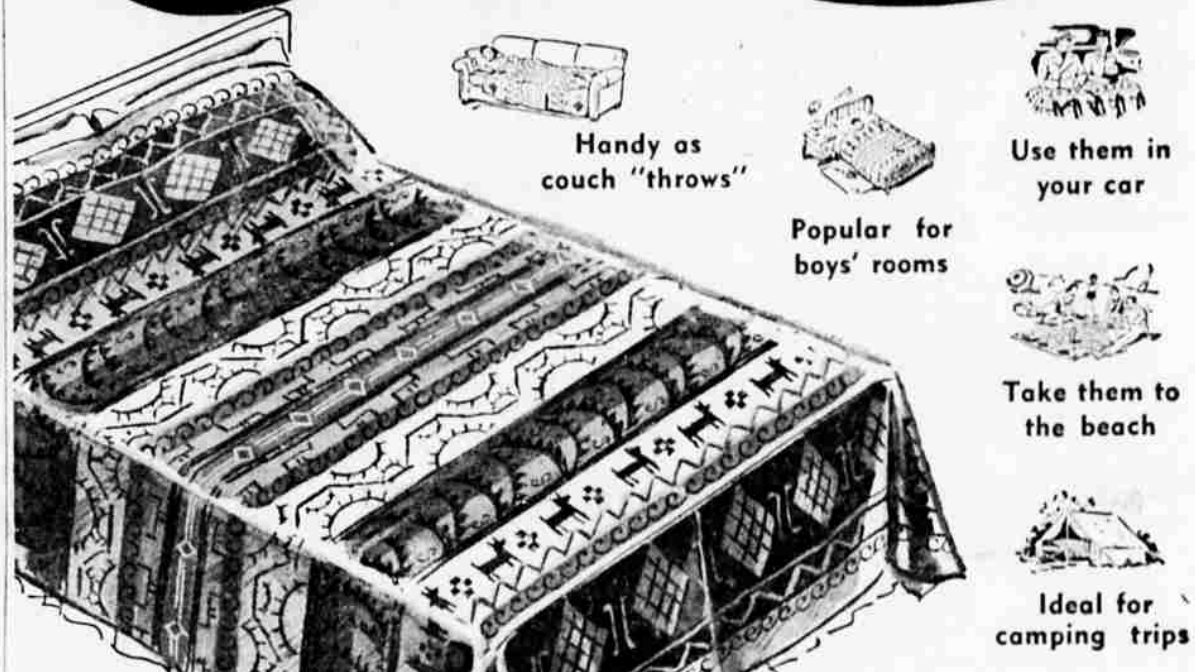

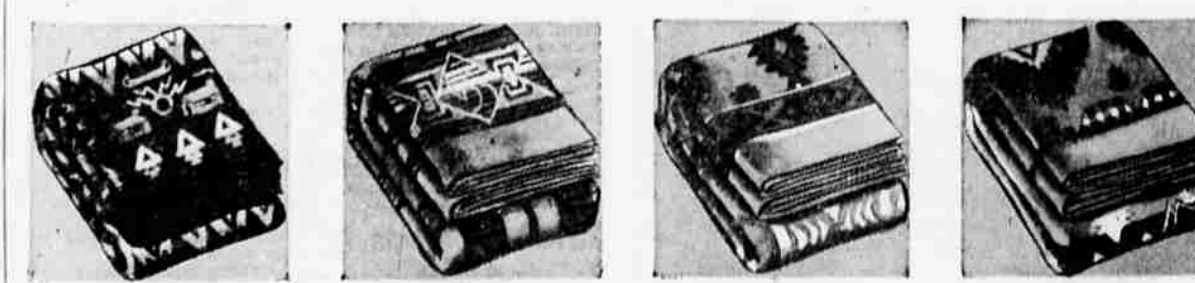
