

Driver Gets 10-Day Jolt

James O. Robertson, 25, of route 1, was sent to a city jail cell Thursday morning for a 10-day stay after he pleaded guilty in police court to driving a car while his operator's license is revoked.

Police said that Robertson's license was revoked some time ago in justice court on conviction of drunk driving and since that time a fine of \$50 was paid for him by his father the first time he was caught driving a car.

This time Police Judge Howard Brode decided 10 days behind bars would be a better cure than a fine. Other arrests by city police during the past 24 hours included six for intoxication and four for traffic violations.

Warren Leslie Pohl, 36, 2329 Wantland, paid a \$25 fine on a charge of reckless driving after he was involved in a minor auto accident at S. 6th and East Main last night. A five-day jail sentence was suspended.

Leo Stanfield, 20, 27, 1501 Hope, was cited for a court appearance on a charge of speeding, and Calvin C. Gay, 21, 1521 Sargent, log truck driver, was fined \$5 each on charges of violating a city ordinance which requires steel braces for log-trailer hitch and for having an improper muffler.

Frank Galbreath, 26, 2219 S. 6th, posted \$5 bail for allowing a dog to run at large.

The city jail had Ernest D. Wells, 39, of Dorris, as a visitor last night. He was held for release to U. S. army authorities as a deserter.
