

Seraphs Hang Third In Row On Hollywood

Beavers Manage First Tally In 27 Full Innings

The Hollywood baseball stars are being clubbed to death with the same script.

Three nights running, Los Angeles high-flying Angels have come up with extra-inning home runs to whip the Stars, and for filmland fans it has been nothing short of murder.

It was Jim Tabor's two-run circuit smash in the 11th that broke it up, 9-7, for the Angels last night. Tabor was the same gent who broke it up in the 10th frame Tuesday. Wednesday it was Don Dallesandro's 11th inning homer that did the trick.

Gorty Matzberger, former reliever for the Chicago White Sox, was the victim of Tabor's long poke. San Francisco kept a few percentage points ahead of the second-place Angels with a 3-1 triumph over Portland, the third in a row for the Beas. San Francisco supported Tommy Pine's seven-hit pitching by pushing across two runs in the fourth and another in the seventh. Portland's lone tally was the first for the Beavers in 27 innings.

WALKED AWAY

Oakland literally walked to victory over Sacramento 6-4 as Solon Starler Emmett O'Neill dished out 12 passes in five and two-thirds innings before Manager Joe Oringo could stand no more.

San Diego and Seattle split their doubleheader with San Diego bouncing back from a 4-2 first game defeat to take the afternoon, 11-4. Left-hander Herb Karpis pitched a three-hitter in Seattle's win which was marred only by a homer by Buster Adams with one aboard.

Adams also clouted a round-tripper in the second game for San Diego but it fell to Johnny Barrett to lead the Padre attack with a single, double, triple and walk. Seattle scored first in the night-cap but San Diego countered with two runs in the second inning and was never headed thereafter.

Navy Boxers From East Pace Trials

SAN DIEGO, May 7 (AP)—Fighters from the Atlantic fleet and the sea forces centered around San Diego dominated the all-navy boxing championships today.

The tournament finals are scheduled tomorrow night. The Atlantic crew captured four out of 16 semi-finals matches last night. The San Diego contingent did likewise.

Horace (Hammering Hank) Herring of St. Petersburg, Fla., led the San Diego fighters. He defended his navy welterweight title by knocking out Eddie Mullin of Wilkes-Barre, Pa., in the second round. Mullin fought for the Mississippi valley team.

Herring's final match will be against Bill Bullock, Enfield, N. C., representing the northwestern team. Bullock knocked out George Woods of St. Louis, of the Pacific fleet Hawaiian area team, in the first round. In a middleweight bout, Otis M. Perry, Atlantic fleet, Kings Mountain, N. C., 157 lb., defeated Phillip Goerlich, Mississippi valley, Central Point, Ore., 157.

Dale Daugherty Is OVS Football Coach

OVS, May 7 — Dale Daugherty, present head football coach at Lincoln high in Portland, this morning was hired to take over the gridiron reins at Oregon Vocational school for next season.

The 39-year-old Daugherty is a graduate of Bradley Tech in Illinois and has 14 years of experience in the coaching field, in schools in Illinois and Minnesota before he came to Oregon last year.

Before hooking on at Lincoln, Daugherty was at St. Cloud, Minn., five years as head coach and his teams won 36 out of 40 games. He also coached basketball and football and at OVS may get the job of coaching Owl baseball.

Wakefield On Trade Block

DETROIT, May 7 (AP)—Dick Wakefield, who cost the Detroit Tigers \$52,000 in bonus money in 1941 and is hitting an insignificant .074 for them in 1948, may be on the trading block.

But the Tigers branded as "preposterous" today any idea that Dick may be sold for a \$10,000 waiver price.

Wakefield, a former University of Michigan player, currently is riding the bench for the Tigers with two hits in 27 times at bat this season, hitless in his last 25 times up.

The Detroit Free Press said today that the Tigers have asked waivers on the 27-year-old outfielder, terminating the action "an indication Detroit is trying to trade the player they signed for \$52,000 in 1941."

In 1943 he batted .316 with 206 hits, 38 of them doubles.

PORTLAND, May 7 (AP)—The way was outlined today for possible settlement of the CIO Hatters and Boommen's strike in Oregon and Washington.

Carl Winn, secretary of the negotiating committee from the district council of the International Woodworkers of America, said the settlement could be on a local basis.

If the individual employers meet the union's full demands, local units may accept, he said.

Winn said local units and employers both had suggested this arrangement. He asserted this "might be the break" to end the deadlock.
