

MARKETS and FINANCIAL GRAINS ON STEADY SIDE

CHICAGO, May 6 (AP)—With the railroad strike situation attracting most attention, grains held firm on the board of trade today. In the first few minutes prices slipped below the previous close, but the market rallied quickly.

Late in the session there appeared to be some shifting from May wheat into deferred deliveries. May, strongest contract in all recent sessions, lost some of its premium over the July future.

Wheat closed unchanged to 2 cents higher. May \$2.47-2.46 1/2, corn was 1/4 to 2 cents higher. May \$2.23 1/2, oats were 1/4-1/2 higher, May \$1.13 1/2-1, and soybeans were 7 to 8 cents lower, May \$3.97.

Rails, Oils Aid Stocks

NEW YORK, May 6 (AP)—Strength of selected rails and oils today helped prop a still somewhat shaky stock market.

Individual issues pushed forward after an early slide with carriers reflecting hopes that the threatened railway strike would be averted.

While top marks running to a point or more were reduced here and there near the close, advances held a wide majority.

Transfers were in the vicinity of 1,300,000 shares.

Touching 1948 peaks were Northern Pacific, Baltimore & Ohio, Seaboard Oil, Union Carbide and Brooklyn Union Gas (on another trade).

Better performers included Santa Fe, N. Y. Central, Pennsylvania Railroad, Nickel Plate Railroad, Texas Co., Standard Oil (N. J.), U. S. Steel, Boeing, Phelps Dodge, American Woolen, International Paper and Paramount Pictures.

Bonds were a trifle uneven. Grain and cotton futures tilted upward.

Rail Relocation Bids Returned

PORTLAND, May 6 (AP)—Seventeen bids were on file today for proposed relocation of 3 1/2 miles of the Spokane and Seattle railroad line involved in building McNary dam.

The army engineers reported bids ranged from a low of \$274,026 submitted by White Brothers company, Walla Walla, to \$917,057 by Sabastian-Albergo company, Chicago. The government estimate was \$324,484.

The work will start 3.8 miles west of Plymouth, Benton county, Wash., and continue to a point near the western axis of the dam.
