Ted Williams Smashes Two Homers Though Indians Humble Sox Twice

This is kindly old Connie Mack's 86th year—his 64th in baseball—and it promises to be one of his happiest.

The venerable manager of the patched-up Philadelphia Athletics, who has experienced innumerable thrills in his 48 seasons as boss of the same club, must be having the time of his life watching his "cast-off crew" make monkeys out of the so-called elite of the American league.

Only a mathematical oddity keeps this much-abused outfit from occupying first place in the American league. After yesterday's double victory over the Detroit Tigers, 10-5 and 5-3, which boosted their winning streak to eight games, the Athletics actually lead the first place Cleveland Indians by a half game.

Cleveland had two triumphs over the Red Sox in Boston, 4-1 and 9-5.

The Indians surprised the Red Sox by coming from behind twice to capture their doubleheader. Trailing 1-0 on Ted Williams' fourth-inning home run, the Indians drew even in the next stanza when Ken Keltner connected for the first of his three home runs. Keltner's second four-base knock came in the 10th inning and sparked a three-run rally.

Williams' second home run of the day and seventh of the season gave the Red Sox a brief 2-1 lead in the second game, but the Indians came back with three round trippers to win.

Week-End Produces Two Victories For Local Diamonders

Two victories over the week-end were racked up by the Klamath Falls Gems and the locals will be trying to stretch the streak to three tonight as the hop-skip Klamath-Medford series comes back to Gems stadium for renewal. The tilt is scheduled for 8 p. m. under the floodlights.

The Gems topped the Dodgers 10-1 here Saturday night, then yesterday afternoon at Medford's Fairgrounds park bested the Dodgers 15-12 in a slugfest. Klamath was won three of the four games in the six-date home and home series which ends over the hill tomorrow night.

Saturday night's game was another chilly one but featured the fine blowing of Joe Nicholas, a boy with fair speed, a good curve and almost perfect control. Nicholas put a third strike by 15 Dodgers, allowed only two walks and six hits.

The Gems made hay off the slants of Dick Lowe, getting nine runs in the first four innings. Lefthander Dick Pera relieved Lowe in the fourth and held the Klamath hitters in check fairly well the rest of the way.

BASES CLEANED

A triple with the bases loaded by Joe Anselmo was the blow that sent Lowe back to the locker room. Little Nicholas helped himself to a triple and a single at the plate.

Sunday's game, first afternoon scrap of the season, saw John Lopenman get a rough going over the Dodgers in the first three innings but stuck it out and come out winner. Medford counted 10 times those frames.

The Gems picked up one run in the second, five in the third and one in the fourth, then collected six in their half of the seventh to take the lead.

Paul Peterson started for the Dodgers and Manager Larry Shepard removed himself after issuing three passes in the seventh and Andy Nunez was the loser.

Five passes, two wild pitches, a double by Hal Taylor and singles by Tom Mankey and Lopenman were scattered into that stanza.

Lopenman held his own in the later frames and wound up fanning 10.
