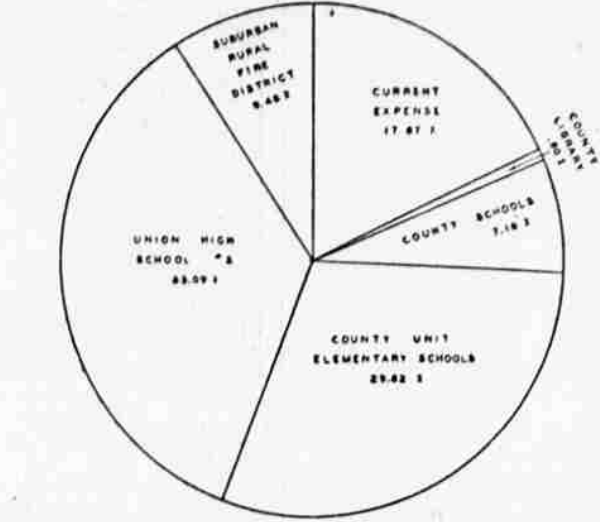
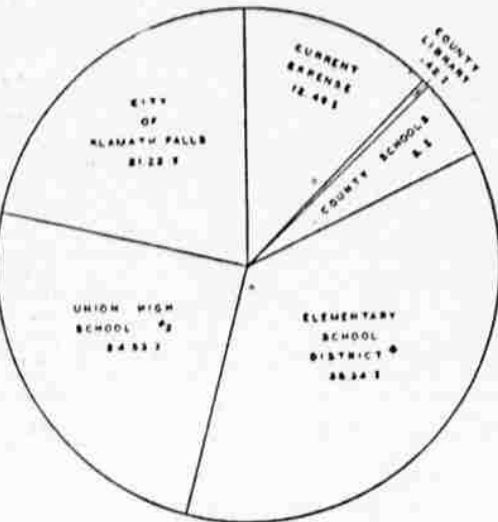

Where does your tax money go? Well, these charts, prepared in the county assessor's office and based on 1947-48 levy rates and assessments give a picture of how the money property owners pay in to the county each fall is divided.

Starting today, The Herald and News will run a series of like drawings, showing the division of property tax money taken from each region of Klamath County.

Municipalities get some, county government gets a share of every dollar, in some cases park or fire districts take a cut, the county library gets a little, but in almost every case the school systems get and spend almost two-thirds of the total amount of tax money taken in.

The tax chart for the corporate

limits of the city of Klamath Falls shows 21.22 per cent of each tax dollar going to city government for administration, police, fire, streets and the like.

The county government gets to keep 12.49 per cent. The county library gets less than half of one per cent.

All the rest, almost 66 per cent, goes to schools, to run Klamath Union high school, the elementary schools and as the city's part of the costs of county schools.

These percentages are based on the 1947-48 rate of taxation, which in Klamath Falls was 78.7 mills or \$78.70 on each \$1000 of assessed valuation of property.

Both Klamath Union high school board and the city elementary school board have drawn up bud-

gets for 1948-49 asking for sizable increases in local property tax income. The elementary board is asking \$376,910.36 over and above the amount of taxes it can levy without a vote, and the Klamath Union high school board is asking \$311,367.03 more.

Both districts have called for special elections next Monday, May 17, to allow taxpayers to vote on the proposed budgets and the proposed tax increases. These special school elections are scheduled for a time just four days prior to the May 21 political primaries.

Voting in the elementary district will be done at Fremont school between 2 p. m. and 7 p. m. High school district voting is done in the main KUIS building, same hours.

If the measures pass, taxes will go up.

The county school board also has called for an election May 17 to get an okay from property owners to levy taxes to raise an extra \$381,252.92 for the next fiscal year. County voting will be done at the various county elementary school buildings at 2 p. m.

The second illustration, labeled "Klamath county unit elementary and union high No. 2" pertains to the suburban area east of Klamath Falls inside the suburban rural fire district, where students go to county elementary schools but come to KUIS for the upper grades.

There the 1947-48 tax levy was 55 mills, with each agency receiving shares as indicated in the diagram.

RESOLUTION NO. 314

A RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR THE CITY OF KLAMATH FALLS, OREGON, TO RAISE FUNDS TO BE USED BY THE RECREATION COMMITTEE, FOR THE PURPOSE OF ACQUIRING, OPERATING, MAINTAINING, IMPROVING AND DEVELOPING RECREATION CENTERS, AND FOR RECREATION ACTIVITIES, CREATING A LEVY OF ONE AND ONE-HALF MILLS UPON THE DOLLAR OF ALL TAXABLE PROPERTY IN KLAMATH FALLS, OREGON OWNED OR HEREINAFTER ACQUIRED BY IT, AND EACH YEAR THEREAFTER, FOR THE PURPOSE OF AMENDING THE CITY CHARTER OF KLAMATH FALLS, OREGON SAID OBJECTIVES AND PURPOSES MAY BE ACCOMPLISHED, CALLING A SPECIAL ELECTION FOR THE PURPOSE OF VOTING UPON THE MATTER, PROVIDING A BALLOT TITLE FOR THE QUESTION TO BE SUBMITTED AND DIRECTING THE POSTING AND PUBLICATION OF ELECTION NOTICES AND DIRECTING ALL THINGS NECESSARY TO BE DONE IN CONNECTION WITH SAID ELECTION, AND REPEALING RESOLUTION NO. 313.
