## Irrigation To Start Saturday

**PASCO, Wash., May 12 (AP)—**The Columbia basin is a vast drab carpet but irrigation water soon will start trimming the edges with green. Pumps will start Saturday on the Pasco unit of the million-acre Columbia basin project. The water they draw from the mighty Columbia will be the first delivered

by the bureau of reclamation in the project. Bureau spokesmen said the water delivered to the 5500-acre Pasco unit will be a tiny fraction of the flow which ultimately will be diverted to the same-covered basin. Completion of the major irrigation systems in the huge project still is years ahead. The schedule of development of the whole area is subject to continued congressional appropriations in the future. A celebration scheduled Saturday to observe the openings of the first unit has been postponed until next month. President Truman has planned a trip to the Northwest then, and Pasco civic leaders hope he will be able to attend a formal celebration.

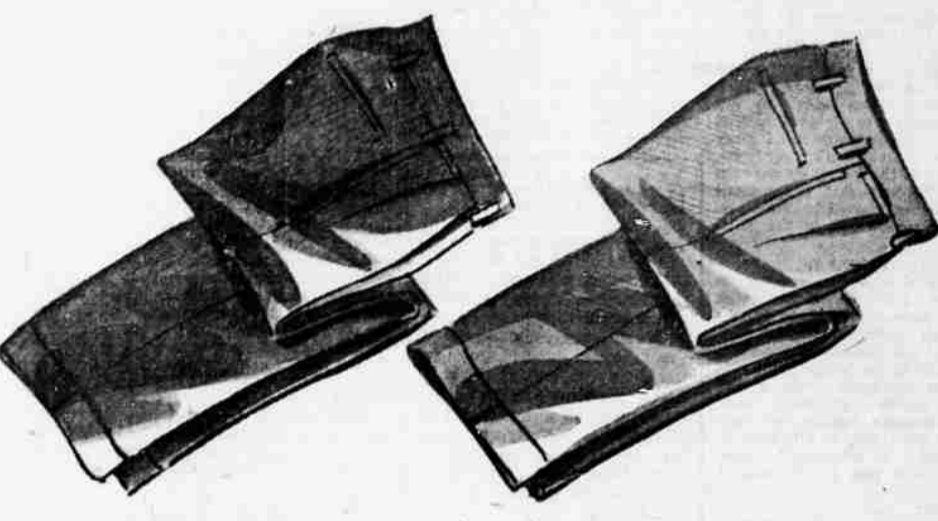
