

Ted Conn To Attend Rogue Dam Meeting

PORTLAND, May 19 (AP)—Oregon's state game commission, opposed to a proposed dam construction program on the Rogue river, will be represented at a June 8 hearing at Medford by Theodore R. Conn, commissioner from Lakeview.

The reclamation bureau hearing is intended to get views of residents of the area to the power and irrigation proposals. Because of the sports fishing value of the Rogue, opposition from those interests is expected to be strong.

The game commission, in a report issued last month in conjunction with the U. S. fish and wildlife service, recommended that congress dedicate the Rogue as a recreation stream, with no dams to be permitted on the main stream, including the North fork.

Recommendations said the Lewis creek dam and the Lost creek dam—suggested in alternate proposals—should be dropped, but that an annual loss charge of \$400,000 be placed against the Lewis creek dam and of \$174,000 against the Lost creek dam if built. These are the figures set as monetary loss of the fishery if the dams are built.

The report says it would be neither economically sound or biologically feasible to attempt to save the fish runs if the proposed Lewis creek dam on the Upper Rogue or the Copper canyon or Rainey falls dams on the Lower Rogue were built.

It added that dams suggested for tributaries would do far less harm to the fishery resources of the Rogue than those proposed for the main stream, but it suggested adequate minimum stream flows should be provided if they were built.

SALEM, May 19 (AP)—The state board of control Tuesday awarded a \$1,669,805 contract for construction of a new state office building to Sound Construction Co., Seattle.

The company was the lowest of six bidders. The contract for the five-story structure is \$250,000 under the architect's estimate.

The same company now is building a ward building and a nurses' home at the Oregon state hospital.

The new building will be located across the street from the front of the state capitol. It will be financed by borrowing from the state school fund at 3 per cent interest.

The money will be repaid to the fund in 30 years by departments using the building.

Larson Okayed For WAA Head Post WASHINGTON, May 19 (AP)—The senate Tuesday confirmed the nomination of Jess Larson of Oklahoma to be war assets administrator.

The senate acted by voice vote after defeating, by a standing vote, a motion by Senator Tydings (D-Md.) to send the nomination back to the expenditures committee. That group had already approved Larson's five months old appointment unanimously.

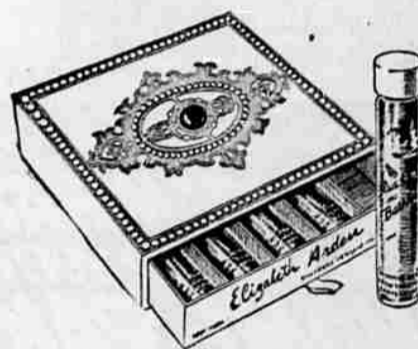
