

# Upkeep Of Cemetery Aim Of Levy

The city would have about \$6000 annually to use exclusively for Linkville's upkeep.

The fund would be separate from the Klamath Memorial park fund, which was established by a special levy in 1945 to give \$60,000 for the cemetery, and \$40,000 for construction of a mausoleum. The levy will continue for one year, according to Mayor Ed Ostendorf.

After the levy is exhausted, the Memorial park will be self-supporting with 25 per cent of the sale of lots used for its maintenance.

**Veneer Corporation Contracts Okayed**

ABERDEEN, May 20 (AP)—Employees of the Grays Harbor Veneer corporation at Hoquiam and the Coast Veneer company in Portland have ratified new contracts and called off their month-old strike, union leaders said today.

The agreement calls for a 10-cent hourly wage increase retroactive to April 1, further negotiations on wages early in July, and withdrawal of company demands for five modifications in the contract.

The announcement, made by John Pitas, business agent of the CIO Plywood Workers Union here, and District Representative B. J. Beverson, Portland, did not disclose either the original union demands or present wage scales.
