Potato Supply Outlook From Early June Until Fall Not Good For Market

Potato supply outlook, from early June until harvest in the late crop starts, is not good marketwise. Last official crop report for the spring and summer harvests shows prospects for approximately 66 million bushels, which is 10 million bushels more than the large crop of last season.

ernment bought some 15 million bushels to support prices for the early commercial crop the last season and is likely to take at least 25 per cent more potatoes this season in order to make price support effective.

Deadline Set For Potato Goal Report

The county AAA committee has set May 25 as the deadline for receiving downward changes in potato goals. The committee is asking that all growers who do not intend to plant their full goal, as given them, report before the expiration date to the county committee, changes in the acreage they intend to plant.

Currently the market supply has bulged. Track holdings are but little changed from a week ago but shipments during the past week advanced sharply from 457 cars the previous week to a total of 545 1/2 cars for the last seven-day period.
