

Gems Gain Third In Routing Diamonds

Santa Rosa Next On Klamath Agenda

The Klamath Falls Gems were on their way to Santa Rosa today and also apparently on their way to the top of the Far West baseball league pile following a triple win over the Pittsburgh Diamonds Saturday and Sunday. The Saturday tilt was a light one, 5 to 4, but the Sunday doubleheader saw the Gems compile the astronomical scores of 20-3 and 26-2.

Things were so bad that Manager Gus Suhr, former big league first baseman, finally took the mound for the Diamonds in the sixth frame of the nightcap.

As an indication of how bad things were, the Gems had 24 men go to bat in that inning and scored 10 runs.

At any rate, the three wins moved Klamath Falls up to third place in the league, a jump from fifth, and they happen to be only two games behind the league-leading Santa Rosa Pirates.

Santa Rosa's lead is very much in danger in the series down there which starts Tuesday night.

Saturday's game was a good one, marked by two clean home runs from the bat of Gems Manager Joe Gantenben. Joe treated the right field fence as if he owned it in the first and fifth innings. The bags were vacant each time.

Art Moyer struck out 10 in fashioning that win.

In the opener Sunday John Lopezman gave the Diamonds just seven hits and fanned eight, while Bob Boyce, the loser for Pittsburgh, lasted only one-third of an inning before being shelled off the mound. Dave Stratton relieved and was target for plenty of heavy cannonading the rest of the way.

The nightcap was slated for only seven innings and Jack Stone started on the hill for Pittsburgh. The left-hander allowed five runs in the second frame but otherwise did all right until taken out for a pinch hitter in the fifth.

His successor, Bob Boyce, fared no better than he had in the first game and the big 19-run sixth frame came primarily off him. Suhr came in to toss a few after Art became painfully apparent that only time was going to put the Gems out.

Larry Guelfo elbowed for the Gems and gave up only two hits, a triple and double successively in the third inning.
