Advance Forecast Puts Cost Of Election Here At \$12,000

The cost to Klamath county of last Friday's primary elections has not been computed yet but election board clerks and judges alone cost \$3643.00, County Clerk Charles DeLap said Wednesday.

When the final figures are in, it is expected that the election will have cost \$12,000 or more.

Official counters are struggling through a mass of tally sheets trying to get exact counts for each office from each precinct. Today they reported that William Orville Douglas, U. S. supreme court justice, is heading the list of write-ins for vice president of the United States on the democratic ballot. Justice Douglas is also reported to be getting most of the write-in votes for that party preference over the state.

A situation is developing in the matter of republican nomination for county coroner where there was no name printed on the GOP ballot. Dr. George H. Adler was unopposed for the democratic nomination.

Although write-ins for that nomination have not been counted, a perusal of several precinct tally sheets shows that some write-in votes were cast for Dr. J. Martin

Adams, some of Dr. J. M. Cronin, others for Deputy Coroner Marvin Albee and also for Earl Whitlock.

Legal deadline for candidates in the primary to report campaign expenses is June 5, DeLap said, and blanks for reporting may be obtained at the clerk's office.

None had turned in expense reports Wednesday.

Actor Stops At Airport

Powell has just finished working in a picture for Universal studio entitled "Rogue's Regiment," which will probably be released some time in November, he said.

The charge was signed by the girl's father.

Shong, mahrt said, had lived in Chiloquin since 1926.

Machine Shop Sale Complete

Sale of the Klamath Machine and Locomotive Works, located on Spring street, has been completed with the recording of a deed transferring ownership of the plant to a group of San Francisco businessmen who have formed an organization known as "Civic Associates."

Revenue stamps on the document indicated a consideration of about \$114,000.

The new owners have formed a Delaware corporation and the new name of the plant will be Klamath Machine and Locomotive Works, Inc. New manager is Ray Williams, formerly of Salmes, Calif., and William Whelan is assistant manager.

In 1930 the plant, then known as Klamath Iron Works, was purchased by the Gerlinger family of Dallas from Walter Beane, and through the years since that time it has become a family holding with exceptions of interests owned by Homer Ellis and Eugene Hooker, both of Klamath Falls.

Ellis said that he and Hooker planned to remain in Klamath Falls but were no longer connected with the plant which has been entirely taken over by the new owners.

The deed conveying the property to the San Francisco group is signed by members of the Gerlinger family as well as Hooker and Ellis.

US Lifts Ban On Shipping

WASHINGTON, May 27 (AP)—The United States Wednesday partly lifted a virtual ban on exports of industrial goods to Soviet-dominated Eastern Europe by approving a \$3,890,000 shipment to Finland.

Secretary of Commerce Sawyer announced the action but gave no explanation.

He said he has approved granting licenses for shipment of power generator parts, machine tools, steel products and other materials.

He added he expects to grant further approvals "in the near future."
