No testimony was given at Thursday's hearing which was a continuation of Tuesday's preliminary hearing at which time Mrs. Ray testified. Ray did not testify at either the inquest or hearing.

Floating Court On Murder Case

KETCHIKAN, Alaska, May 28 (AP)—The "floating court" waited today at Dutch Harbor for arrival of the government research ship Pacific Explorer with the body of a shipboard slaying victim and his slayer.

District Judge Joseph Kenoe, now conducting court aboard the coast guard ice breaker Northwind at Dutch Harbor in the Aleutians, ordered the Pacific Explorer to put into port immediately.

Word of the slaying was relayed here yesterday by the cutter Bittersweet. The cutter said it had received a message saying: "There has been a murder aboard the Pacific Explorer."

The message said the slayer had surrendered his gun to the captain. It did not identify either the victim or his slayer.

The Pacific Explorer left Seattle March 26 to study undeveloped fishing resources in the Bering Sea. It carries a crew of 67 and more than 150 cannery workers.
