

Suburban Fire District Ready To Go With All New Equipment

which provides room for two big white trucks. One is a regular, fully equipped fire engine with the latest type equipment and the second is a tanker with capacity for 1000 gallons of water.

Chief's Quarters

In addition the building provides a modern three-room apartment for the fire chief, a recreation room, dormitory, dressing room, a second kitchen for "snacks" for the men on duty and plenty of storage space.

The building is heated with two gas furnaces.

Someone will be on duty 24 hours a day and fifty volunteers, living or working within a radius of one mile of the station have been enrolled. The 50 men who make up the suburban volunteer fire department have an organization of their own independent of the district.

John Cotton is president, John Hemstreet, vice president, and P. W. Koberg is secretary.

This group plans purchase of a re-suscitator at a cost of \$500 which will be left at the station and may be used by anyone in an emergency. One of the newest on the market, it has many advantages over the pulmotor. It will be the only one of its kind in Klamath Falls.

The baby food CARE package is for babies over six months old and contains whole milk powder, infant cereal food, ascorbic acid tablets, vitamin A and D. concentrates, granulated sugar, 30 cans of strained baby food, soap, can opener, tablespoon, teaspoon and measuring spoon.

PORTLAND, May 28 (AP)—Backwaters of the flood-swollen Columbia river have reduced the fall of water at Bonneville dam, cutting power output by about 30 per cent, D. L. Mariett said Thursday.

Mariett, assistant Bonneville administrator, said no power shortage would result as steam plants would increase their output.

He said normally there is a 55 to 60-foot fall but that now has been reduced to about 40 feet.
