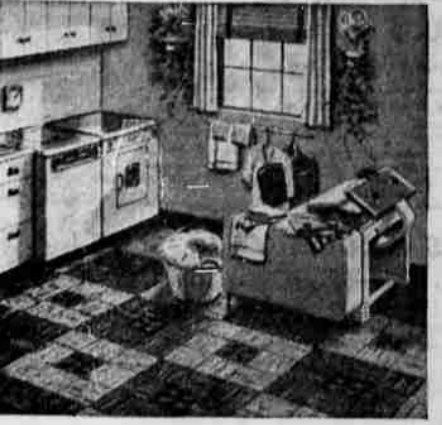


## Truck Windows Shot Full Of Holes
