

Alturas Trek Plans Final

ALTURAS, June 1—All arrangements for the caravan to Winnemucca, Nevada on the 12th of June have been completed. Civic organizations and chambers of commerce in Northern California and Southern Oregon, have been notified, and a large delegation is expected to make the trip.

The Modoc county chamber of commerce will be hosts to the delegation Friday night when a dinner will be served to those attending from outside points. In the morning they will be served breakfast by the chamber and the caravan will leave here by 9:00 a. m.

Cedarville will have a basket lunch prepared which will be served at noon on some selected spot of the highway crossing Washoe county, Nevada. Arriving at Winnemucca at 6:00 p. m. they will be entertained by the Winnemucca chamber of commerce, and the big meeting will be held on Sunday, June 13.

Anyone having an interest in promoting the building of a highway from Winnemucca to Eureka, are asked to attend. Laura Stark, secretary of the Modoc county chamber of commerce, asks that anyone intending to make the trip, to inform her so that arrangements can be made for the over night stop in Alturas and she can inform the Winnemucca chamber secretary of the number expected, so he can arrange for the over night stop in that city. The caravan will be hosts of the chamber in Winnemucca at the new Sonoma Inn in that city.
