

Klamath County School District To Vote On New Board Member On June 21

Resident taxpayers of the Klamath county school district will choose a new member of the school board and vote on a 10-mill five-year serial levy during a special election June 21.

E. W. Gowen of Bonanza, member of the school board, will be running for county commissioner as republican candidate next November, and is stepping out of the school board.

His term on the board expires June 30.

Cecil C. Haley of Bonanza and Lloyd L. Crawford, Langell valley, have filed as candidates for the vacant post. Deadline for filing is June 14 and the term of the person elected to the board will be five years.

Gowen was appointed in November, 1945, to replace Rix High on the school board.

The position open is that of the eastern zone of the county district, comprising the towns of Bonanza, Olene, Dairy, Hildebrand, Beatty Sprague River, Bly and surrounding area. Candidates must live in that zone but the voting will be county-wide.

Members of local school boards will handle the June 21 special elections and voting will take place from 2 p. m. until 7 p. m. in each of the county elementary school buildings.

The serial tax levy of 10 mills for five years has been deemed necessary to carry on a building program outlined by the school board. At present assessed valuation of property in the county school district the levy would bring in a quarter of a million dollars a year or about \$1,250,000 in five years.

However, since assessed valuations are being raised by the assessor's office now, the total income may be considerably more over the five-year period if the tax measure passes.

The county school board has decided on two main projects if the money is voted. One is the construction of a 10-classroom elementary school on Bristol avenue, and the other is construction of a new high school building, cafeteria and elementary playground at Henley.

Other suggested and possible improvements to the school system's physical plant being contemplated by members of the school board include:

Two classrooms at Keno, two classrooms at Bly, two classrooms and bleachers at Fairhaven, elementary playground and cafeteria at Shasta, elementary playground at Malin, elementary building and cafeteria at Merrill, one classroom at Gilchrist, one elementary classroom at Summers, gymnasium, shop, home ec department and science lab at Chiloquin.

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No Children Lost In Flood

The Klamath chapter, American Red Cross, advised today that the Portland chapter reports no lost children as a result of the Vanport flood.

Mrs. Frances Palmer, executive secretary, said officers of homes had reached her office but that all children had been located with their families.

A previous story had been circulated that many children were being cared for by the Red Cross in Portland and that their parents had not been located.

NEW YORK, June 4 (AP)—Walter Winchell will end his radio contract with the Andrew Jergens Co., next December 31 and has signed an agreement with the American Broadcasting company for 52 broadcasts guaranteeing him \$520,000 in 1949.

Variety, theatrical weekly, reported the 16 years association of Winchell and the cosmetic manufacturer was "dissolved as much by the manufacturer's refusal to perfume a rather odorous commercial tagged onto Winchell's time during recent weeks" as by larger financial offers.

Winchell's office confirmed this as "completely correct."
