## Federal Judge Orders Lewis To Bargain With Southern Coal Producers

WASHINGTON, June 4 (2)—Federal Judge Alan T. Goldsborough today ordered John L. Lewis to bargain with the Southern Coal Producers association, headed by Jo-seph E. Moody.

Goldsborough granted a court order asked by attorneys representing Robert N. Denham, general counsel of the national labor relations board.

The judge said that it was ap-parent from the record that Lewis did not want to bargain with the Southern association because he wanted to "destroy" it.

He suggested that the United Mine Workers chief might desire to bring about the destruction of the Southern association "because it is barder to deal with" a single unit than with representatives of the 14 smaller associations through the
