# Federal Judge Orders Lewis To Bargain With Southern Coal Producers

WASHINGTON, June 4 (AP)—Federal Judge Alan T. Goldsborough today ordered John L. Lewis to bargain with the Southern Coal Producers association, headed by Joseph E. Moody.

Goldsborough granted a court order asked by attorneys representing Robert N. Denham, general counsel of the national labor relations board.

The judge said that it was apparent from the record that Lewis did not want to bargain with the Southern association because he wanted to "destroy" it.

He suggested that the United Mine Workers chief might desire to bring about the destruction of the Southern association "because it is harder to deal with" a single unit than with representatives of the 11 smaller associations through the South which make up the association.

"Unreasonable" "Certainly it's unreasonable in this present case for the union to say 'We're entitled to one representative for 99 units and the Southern Producers association is not entitled to one representative for 14 associations' "he continued.

"That is not only not logical, but it is not reasonable," the judge said.

New contract talks between coal operators and Lewis broke down May 18 when Lewis refused to consent to Moody sitting at the conference table as the association's representative.
