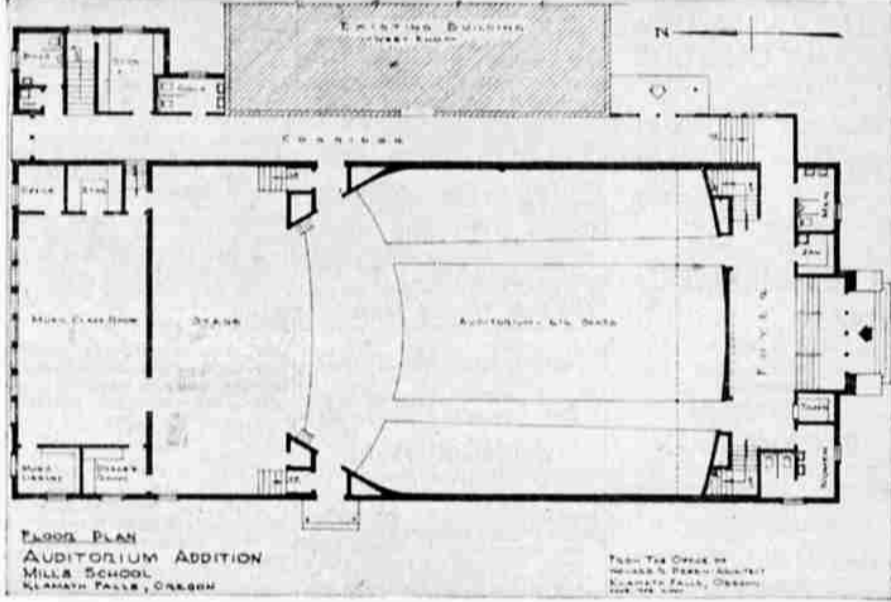
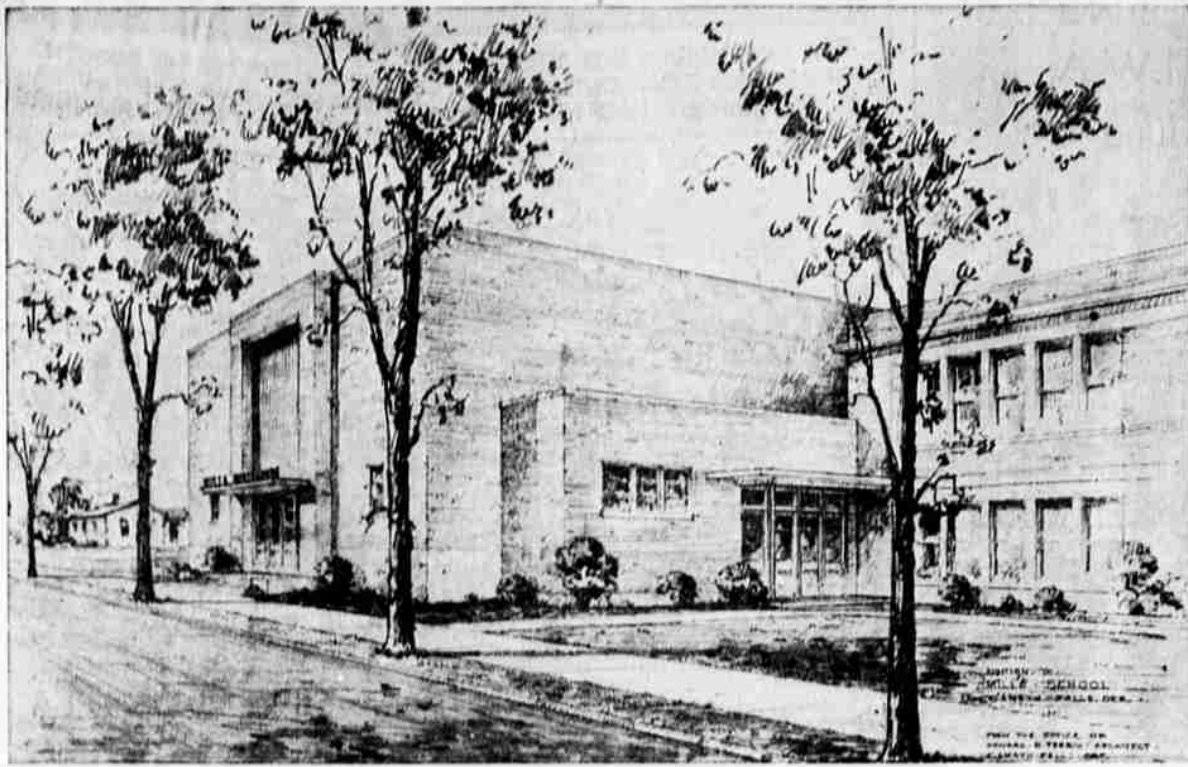


Architect's Drawing Of Proposed Mills School Auditorium



Mills students and the entire Klamath Falls school system will profit when this handsome auditorium adjoining Mills school is completed in late fall. This is the architect's drawing and main floor plan. Not shown is the balcony which will seat 186. The lower level seats 616 persons and has a fully equipped stage, music room on the stage level, connects with the main Mills school structure by a ramp and there is a second entrance through a corridor on the Orchard street wing. Brosterhouse Construction company's low bid of \$132,166 has been accepted and the firm started dismantling the old mess hall at the naval air station. Materials from the mess hall will be used extensively in the auditorium construction. The auditorium is so designed that it may be used as a separate unit without opening the remainder of the school. It has a separate heating line as well. Howard Perri is the architect.

Fire Closure Areas Set

Fire closures in Shasta national forest have been announced by Supervisor Robert E. Jones as extending from June 12 to October 31, 1948, inclusive, for all lands within the national forest. Regulations of the fire prevention program prohibit building a camp fire without a permit from a forest officer. Permits may be obtained in the Klamath Falls forestry office in the post office building, from Clerk Charles Sullaway. Smoking during periods of fire danger which have been publicly announced by the regional forester, is prohibited; throwing or placing burning cigarettes, cigars, matches or any ignited substance in any place where it may start a fire is prohibited. The Trinity county smoking ordinance prohibits smoking within the portions of Trinity county lying within the Shasta national forest. Supervisor Jones states that through the sincere cooperation of the public, man-caused fires on the Shasta forest have been held at low ebb during fire hazard season. Continued cooperation is urgently requested to eliminate man-caused fires.

Princess's Baby Said To Be Girl

LONDON, June 5 (AP)—Genealogists said today they don't know whether Princess Elizabeth's baby will be a boy or a girl, but the odds are heavy against twins. The pedigree tracers have looked into the history of Britain's royalty all the way back to William the Conqueror. In that period, almost 900 years, they found no record of twin births to royal couples in near succession to the throne. "It's amazing," they said. "The odds against Princess Elizabeth having twins are doubtless thousands to one." Ordinarily, twins occur about every 90 births. One of the obstetricians attending Elizabeth is pretty sure her baby, due in the fall, will be a girl. But it is acknowledged that predictions of this nature, based on heartbeats or other criteria, are not certain.

MUNICH, Germany, June 5 (AP)—Nineteen Germans have died and about 680 are ill in a typhoid outbreak at Alt Oetting, 60 miles east of Munich. U. S. authorities said the outbreak, probably caused by infected drinking water, is spreading, but that no Americans are endangered.
