Franklin, Indicted For Murder, Popular Prisoner

Homer Valentine Franklin, who admitted killing his wife and buried her in the back yard of their suburban home last winter, is the most congenial prisoner the county jail has had for a long time.

Raymond Walker, day jailer, swears by the ex-navy petty officer who is awaiting trial on a charge of first degree murder.

Franklin never gives the turnkey any trouble. He is always cheerful and willing to do more than his share of the routine clean-up work around the county lockup.

He is confined to the tier of the jail where all felony prisoners are kept but has the run of the upper story of the building during the day. Franklin spends most of his time reading. Walker says, and seldom cries or grouses like most of the prisoners do habitually. He gets along.

Since he went to jail last January, the 54-year-old Franklin has been on the "outside" a number of times—always in custody of a deputy sheriff.

He had to have considerable dental work done and made frequent trips to a downtown dentist. Also he has had several trips to the courthouse for court hearings, arraignments and the like and has shown some impatience at the frequent postponements of his trial.

Latest date for the court showdown is June 21. Franklin is represented by U. S. Baientine and E. E. Driscoll.

Each Tuesday and Friday is "visiting day" at the jail, from 2 until 4 p. m., and Franklin has visitors, usually relatives, on hand right on the dot every time.
