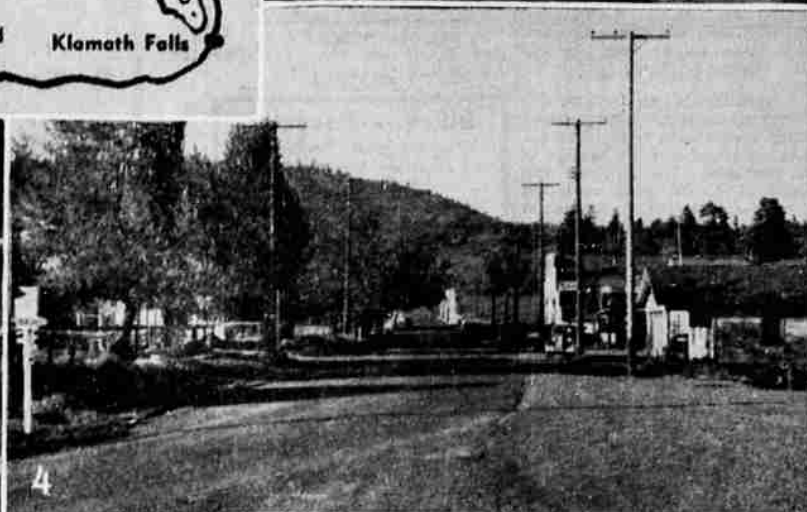
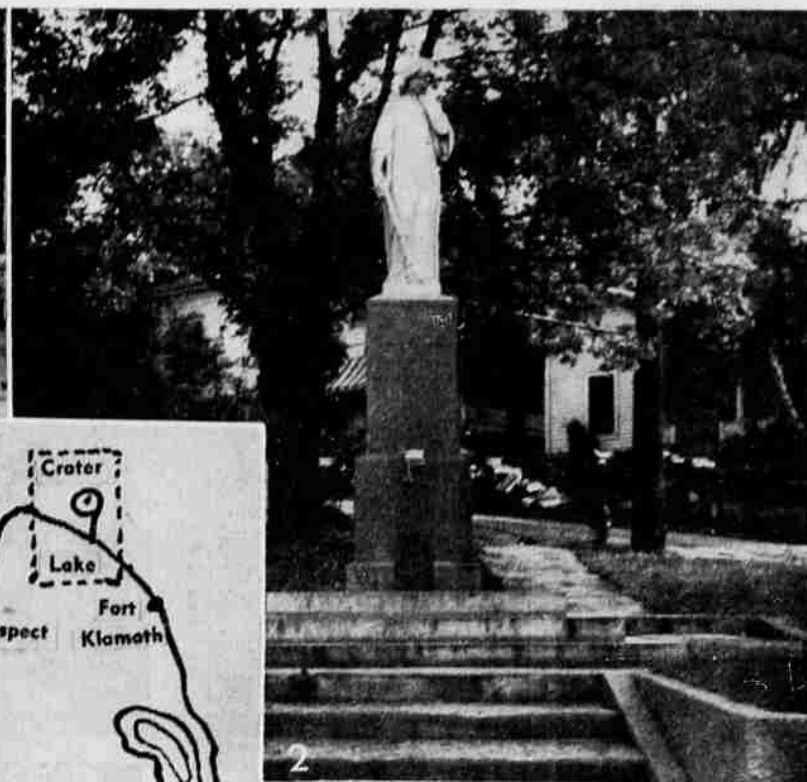




Rogue Valley Via Crater Lake And Back By Greensprings Is Good Trip

A circular trip without backtracking that traverses much of Southern Oregon's finest mountain and valley country is offered the Klamath motorist who goes to the Rogue valley by Crater Lake park and returns by the Greensprings.

A side-trip to Crater lake is available at Annie Springs, but is not included in our mileage table. From Annie Springs the route swings west to Union creek, and south through Prospect and along the beautiful Rogue river into Medford. Dogwood along Crater Lake highway is in full bloom now.

From Medford we drove into Ashland and visited Lithia Springs park, one of the state's finest municipal parks. Homebound over the Greensprings, we found the roadsides without snow. It was warm, and Tub springs is always a must for Greensprings travelers seeking a drink. A half dozen cars were stopped there.

The Greensprings country is at its best right now and we greatly enjoyed our run from Tub Springs on into Keno and to Klamath Falls. This loop trip keeps you on paved road all the way, with no serious grades, but lots of mountains and pretty country.

Woman Agent Shot To Death

PARIS, June 9 (AP)—Genevieve Danelle, gestapo spy, was executed Tuesday.

She was the first woman to face a firing squad in liberated France. An accomplice, Roger Calame, was executed with her.

The woman was convicted of betraying hundreds of members of resistance forces under the German occupation. The prosecution said she helped torture her victims.

She fainted for half an hour when notified she would be shot today.

Calame had feigned insanity since his arrest. He grew a beard, wore a bath robe and claimed to have invented a revolutionary new turbine engine.

He announced before the firing squad, "I pretended to be crazy to save myself. It's over now. The comedy is of no further use."

Iowa Republicans Unseated At Polls

DES MOINES, June 9 (AP)—Iowa's republican governor and one of the three GOP congressmen who had contests were unseated in the primary election Monday.

All other republican incumbents had smooth sailing in an election which attracted an unexpectedly large number of voters.

Gov. Robert D. Blue, seeking his third consecutive term, and Rep. John W. Gwynne, of the third congressional district, were the surprise losers.

State Rep. William S. Beardsley, drugist-farmer from New Virginia, Ia., making his first try for a statewide office, led Blue from the first returns.

Benedetto Croce Refuses Honors

ROME, June 9 (AP)—Benedetto Croce, noted 82-year-old philosopher, was reported Tuesday to have refused a life senatorship.

The new constitution of the Italian republic empowers President Luigi Einaudi to name five outstanding Italians to such posts of honor.

Dispatches from Naples said Croce, who recently resigned as president of the liberal party, wrote Einaudi there was a possibility of his "again desiring to enter politics within a few years."
