

### Truman Calls Newspaper 'Worst In US'

Spokane, June 10 (AP) — The Spokesman-Review said in an editorial today that it "must acknowledge the distinction accorded it" by President Truman, who said here yesterday that the Chicago Tribune and the Spokesman-Review were "the worst in the United States."

Describing the president's visit to Spokane as "a pleasant interlude and a compliment to the city," the paper added:

"He described this newspaper as one of the two 'worse' in the nation and credited them with responsibility for the election of the present congress. The Spokesman-Review can only dismiss the first charge as having been made in a moment of heated partisanship and interpret the second one as a tribute to

the newspaper's influence. Albeit, we fear, at least in part undeserved. "The personal visit of the president, both in his role of chief executive and as a political candidate, was appreciated by Spokane. The welcome mat was out this time, just as it will be the next."

The paper carried a banner story on the front page under the headline "Truman Blames Two Newspapers for 'Worst U. S. Congress.'" The lead story carried the byline of Rhea Feknor, reporter who was questioning the president when the "worst paper" charges were made.

### Well Known Matron Dies

Mrs. Stanford Rugg, 47, Ashland matron who was well known here, died at the Community hospital in the valley city June 8. Death was attributed to a heart attack.

Mrs. Rugg was born in Smith county, Kansas, March 17, 1901, the former Mildred Rae Staub. She came to Oregon with her family in 1911, married December 24, 1935, to Stanford Rugg. She is survived by her husband, five brothers and two sisters, including John Staub and Mrs. Gertrude Stivers of Klamath Falls and Lee Staub of Bly.

Services will be held Friday at 2 p. m. from the chapel of Litwiler and Negent, Ashland, with Rev. A.

### Lobby Blamed For Slow-Up

WASHINGTON, June 10 (AP) — Senator Murray (D-Mont.) believes that "the pressure of powerful lobbies in Washington" has blocked for many years a comprehensive Columbia river development program which would avoid or minimize flood dangers.

"The wholesale destruction, social dislocation and economic loss caused by the flood is a reflection on the intelligence and capacity of congress to meet the problem of major floods in America," he said in a statement.

"If congress would surrender," he continued, "to the private power lobby and provide a program of river valley development under which all electrical power developed should be sold direct to the private utilities at the bus bars, the fight against the proposed river authorities would end immediately."

"Such a program, of course, would be a complete abandonment of the public interest."

### EVERYBODY LIKES FRESH BERRY JAM

Save Sugar and Berries, Get More Glasses This Way

4 Cups Ground Berries (Any Variety)  
8½ Cups Sugar  
1 Package M.C.P. Jam and Jelly Pectin

Wash, stem and grind 3 quarts fully ripe berries, or crush completely one layer at a time so that each berry is reduced to pulp. Measure exactly 4 level cups crushed berries (add water to fill out last cup, if necessary) into a large kettle. (For Strawberry Jam and Black Raspberry Jam add ¼-cup lemon juice to each 4 cups crushed berries). Add the M.C.P. Pectin, stir well, and bring to a boil, stirring constantly. NOW, add the sugar (which has been previously measured), mix well and bring to a full rolling boil. BOIL EXACTLY 4 MINUTES. Remove from fire, let boil subside, stir and skim by turns for 3 minutes. Pour into sterilized jars, allowing ½-inch space for sealing with fresh paraffin.

NOTE: If you cannot get paraffin, use the following "hot seal" method: Pour hot jam into pint or quart Mason jars to the brim; screw lids on tightly (use 2-piece lids) and invert jars on lids until jam begins to set. This sterilizes lids. Then shake jars well and set upright. This keeps fruit evenly distributed.
