

KF Chamber To Support Road Fund

Full support of current efforts to get a deficiency appropriation of \$20,000,000 for forest highways was voted by directors of the chamber of commerce at their meeting Wednesday.

Manager Charles Stark reported that he had already wired Senator Wayne Morse, who has agreed to appear before a congressional subcommittee to plug for the forest road money.

He then read a telegram which Jack Mayne, manager of the Lake county chamber and the Three Flags Highway association, had sent to Morse. The directors authorized Stark to wire Morse that the Klamath chamber agrees with everything stated in Mayne's telegram.

Serious Need

The Willamette highway and the Klamath Falls-Lakeview highways are two roads with projects seriously in need of forest highway funds, Malcolm Epley of the roads committee told the chamber.

Fred Ehlers of the junior chamber of commerce told of final plans for the regatta this week-end and asked for her support.

Arthur Rickbell of the Roundup association outlined the program for this year's wild west show at the fairgrounds. He said that the large purse will bring the finest rodeo talent in the West to the affair here. He pointed out that the roundup association is going on a non-profit basis, and turns all net proceeds over to the county fair board. He cited resultant improvements in the fairgrounds.

It was reported that Sam Ritchey, director in charge of roads, and Epley, will go on the Alturas-arranged tour to Winnemucca through Cedarville this week-end.

Plant Faces Damage Suits

PORTLAND, June 10 (AP) — Damage suits totaling \$1,300,000 have been filed here in federal court by dairy-men and farmers neighboring the aluminum plants at Troutdale, Ore., and Longview, Wash.

The plaintiffs also ask a permanent injunction against continued operation of the plants.

Attorney James Desendorf said

the 97 farmers claim noxious fumes from the plant are destroying crops, orchards and cattle. He said some 100 others in the Washougal, Wash., sector may join in the suit.

E. J. Appel, vice president of the Reynolds Metals company, reported the firm has a staff of scientists working on the fluorine gases emitted by the mills. He said individual damage claims have been settled out of court.

The plaintiffs ask treble damages under Oregon and Washington statutes involving intentional trespass damage.

The Troutdale plant has been

idled by flood threat, but the Longview mill continues. The latter was reopened in March after a long shutdown.
