

Yogi Practice Causes Scare

SAN FRANCISCO, June 11 (AP)—Fred Rutzet, 65, retired seaman, put on his Yogi suit Wednesday night and went out on a fire escape.

A woman on the street screamed. A bartender came out of a corner saloon and bellowed, "He's going to jump!"

Neighbors screamed, "Fire!" Someone called the police, who learned that:

Rutzet's Yogi suit is long underwear.

"It's all Yogi. While I was a seaman on the Great Lakes I saw a sign in Chicago: 'Indo Psychology Taught Here.' I learned Yogi—inhalé 6, stop for 16 heartbeats, exhale 8. 'If it wasn't for Yogi I wouldn't be here,' Rutzet told the cops.

That explanation seemed to satisfy everyone.

Engineer Drowns In Flooded River

TONNE, Wash., June 11 (AP)—A railroad engineer was drowned and two other trainmen were hospitalized Wednesday when two cars of a Milwaukee railroad freight train plunged into the flood-swollen Pend Oreille river.

The drowned man was A. J. Anderson, division engineer from La Crosse, Wash. Hospitalized for observation were Harry Hook, conductor, and Leo Prohl, brakeman, both of Spokane.

Anderson was standing below the track watching the train pass over a bridge and embankment, when the water-softened bank gave way beneath the last two cars of the 13-car train. The plunging cars knocked him into the river. His body was not recovered.

Both Hook and Prohl were riding in the caboose when it left the tracks.

Bike Riding Farmer Killed

ALBANY, Ore., June 11 (AP)—A farmer riding a bicycle on the Pacific highway north of Harrisburg was killed Wednesday by a freight truck trailer.

Deputy Coroner John Summers said the victim, David M. Bieri, 73, living between Halsey and Harrisburg, suffered head and chest injuries.

Summers said the truck driver, Richard B. Crooks, swerved sharply to miss Bieri, but the trailer struck the cyclist as the assembly jerked and plunged into the highway ditch.

Storm Tears Out Power Service

PASCO, June 11 (AP)—Wednesday night's electrical storm resulted in frequent interruptions of power service both here and in Kennewick across the Columbia river. Most serious condition resulted along the river west of Kennewick where power line poles standing on flood-weakened ground were blown over by the high wind.

Efforts are proceeding this morning to restore this line from work barges.

A tree blew down across the main line to the riverview district west of Pasco shutting off power one and one half hours.

Lakeview Group To Put Youth Center In Action

LAKEVIEW, June 10—Formation of the "Lake County Youth Foundation," to further youth organizations here, was nearly complete today as the incorporating group awaited return of its charter from Salem.

Without awaiting completion of the final legal details, the group is proceeding with establishment of a youth center in South Lakeview. They expect to have the building ready for use by all organized youth groups about July 1.

The building is a former schoolhouse owned by the Lakeview Logging company. J. T. McDonald of that company donated the building and had it moved from the firm's logging camp north of Lakeview.

McDonald is also, through the J. T. McDonald-Truman Collins Trust Fund, furnishing the money for remodeling and renovating the building.

The lot on which the youth center is being placed, immediately south of the St. Luke's Episcopal church on F street south, was donated by the Favell-Utley Realty company. Materials for the center are being provided at cost by local mills and businessmen. Andy Redmond is in charge of the work.

The youth foundation was set up as a charity organization in order to receive gifts, donations and other contributions toward support of the center and other youth development activities of the foundation. The incorporators, local civic-minded men

girls' lavatories, storage rooms, and a large kitchen complete with electric range, refrigerator, modern constructed sink and cabinet assembly.

T. R. Conn, attorney and spokesman for the incorporators, said that members of the board of trustees need not be members of the incorporating group.

J. T. McDonald last year, through the McDonald-Collins trust fund, put up the finances for remodeling, decorating, and equipping the Lakeview schools' new kindergarten.

The building for the new youth center was originally built by the Lakeview Logging company at its logging camp and was operated there, until three or four years ago, by School District No. 7 (Lakeview).

Of strong frame construction, it consists of a large classroom, a room for supplies, and a kitchen for hot lunches.

In the new project, this is being placed over a full concrete basement with large meeting rooms up-stairs and down, two fireplaces, boys' and
