**NORTHERN CALIFORNIA** Fair north and partly cloudy south portion with scattered showers and thunderstorms in extreme southern mountains and foothills today, tonight and Thursday. Low overcast and fog on coast. Little temperature change. Moderate northwest winds off coast.

**WESTERN OREGON** Partly cloudy with fog patches along coast and mostly clear interior excepting morning cloudiness northern portion today and Thursday. Little change in temperature with high both days 78 to 88 interior and 58 to 68 on coast. Low tonight 42 to 55. North to northwest winds 10 to 20 miles an hour off coast today increasing to 15 to 25 Thursday.

**EASTERN OREGON** Fair today and Thursday excepting partly cloudy with scattered showers over mountains northeast portions today. Little change in temperature with high both days 80 to 90. Low tonight mostly 42 to 52. But 25 to 30 north portion.
